Aquinas Unbeaten

The "maroon" team of the Aquinas varsity debate squad went undefeated over four rounds at the St. John's University (Long Island) Thanksgiving Forensic Tournament. Seniors Thomas Farrell and James Hendrick switched sides, debating affirmative once and negative three, on the control of nuclear weapons by an international organization.

The tournament, attended by 79 Northeastern high schools, had five schools still unbeaten after the four rounds of sudden death elimination. On speaker-ranks Aquinas was awarded the Third Place Trophy.

In the semi-final round Aquinas eliminated Regis High

Mary A. Sheehan Rewarded By St. Elizabeth's College

The ninth annual Mother Xavier Award of the College of Saint Elizabeth was conferred upon Rochesterian Miss Mary A. Sheehan, noted educator and alumna of the College of Saint Elizabeth on Tuesday, Dec. 1, at a formal faculty and student convocation. The ceremony was followed by a faculty reception and tea for Miss Sheehan and the honored guests.

Miss Sheehan received her Bachelor of Arts degree from the College of Saint Elizabeth in 1913. She earned her Master of Arts degree at the University of Rochester and holds honorary degrees from Nazareth College and from St. John Fisher College. She is at present consultant to the president of St. John Fisher College, where she is Director of the Division of Teacher Education.

MISS SHEEHAN has taught on the elementary, secondary, and university levels. From 1947 to 1960 she served as principal of Monroe High School in Rochester. She holds the distinction of being the first and only woman principal of a secondary school in Rochester.

She has taught summer sessions at the University of North Carolina and has been senior lecturer for summer and regular sessions at the University of Rochester. In 1955 the University of Rochester awarded her an alumni citation in special recognition for service and devotion to the University.

She was the first woman president of the board of governors of the University of Rochester Alumni Federation, and she is the only woman to hold an honorary degree from St. John Fisher College.

At present Miss Sheehan serves on the Monroe County Human Relations Commission; on the board of directors of the Day Care Training Center for Mentally Retarded Children, the Genesee Settlement House, and the Women's Human Relations Council; on the Steering Committee of the Diocesan Schools in Rochester; on the Women's Civic Music Association, on the Policies Committee of the Rochester Association of the United Nations, on the Ralph Bunche School of Leadership Committee of NAACP, and on the Literary Friends of the Rochester Public Library. She is a book reviewer for the Rochester Public Library.

Miss Sheehan is a past president of the Rochester Teachers

Association, the New York State Teachers Association, the Rochester Branch of the American Association of University Women, and the Rochester Teachers Credit Union.

She has served on the New York State Educational Conference Board, the New York Women's Council, the Citizens Committee on Goals for the Rochester Public Schools, the Board of Directors of the Catholic Youth Organization, the Professional Ethics Committee

Rochester City Club. She was the New York State founder of Delta Kappa Gamma.

Miss Sheehan has been honored by such organizations as the American Legion, the National Congress of Parents and Teachers, the State University College at Brockport, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Rochester Business and Professional Women's Club, and the Federation of Women's Clubs. She is a member of the Iota Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa at the University of Rochester.

THE MOTHER Award is the second honor bestowed upon Miss Sheehan by the College of Saint Elizabeth. In 1959 she was the recipient of the Elizabethan Award, an honor given at a convocation during the centennial celebration of the Sisters of Charity of Saint Elizabeth, to selected graduates considered to be representative of the devoted loyalty of all the alumnae of the College.

The Mother Xavier Award was established in 1956 to honor the memory of Mother Mary Xavier Mehegan, foundress of the Sisters of Charity of Saint Elizabeth in 1859 and of the College of Saint Elizabeth, New Jersey's first college for women in 1899. The award consists of a bronze medallion bearing the name of the recipient and is presented annually to an alumna who has rendered devoted service to the College and who exemplifies the ideals it inculcates.

The main address at the convocation this year was delivered by the recipient herself, Miss Sheehan chose for her topic, "Women in Orbit."
