Burl Ives has become a legend in his time as a result of his ever growing popularity among all the music public. His infectious voice and charming style couldn't be better in his new Decca release, titled after his current hit single, Pearly Shells, he adds still another impressive chapter to the world of music.

The master balladeer also sings such other tunes as Don't Let Love Die, Two of the Usual, The Legend of the "T", Lynching Party, Hard Luck and Misery, Okkeechobee Ocean and Who Done It?

You might call Burl Ives a 20th century wandering minstrel. His songs of life and love range from sentimental ballads to humor. But there is one thing they have in common when Burl Ives sings, they are all most pleasing to the ear.

Bert Kaempfert includes some of his own compositions along with some other great music in his latest Decca LP, Blue Midnight. His recently popular hit is here, as are versions of Java and Cotton Candy that would make Al Hirt proud.

The title song is also included as well as Love Comes But Once, Goodnight Sweet Dreams, Love, Lovely Nightingale, Red Roses For a Blue Lady, Three O'Clock in the Morning and three others. All provide pleasant listening. Excellent stereo version.

The Peter Duchin Discotheque Dance Party is the latest addition to the newest musical boom sweeping the country. With one of the top dance bands today featuring the latest dance steps such as the Frog, Mashed Potato and Twist, this Decca album is sure to be a big seller.

With emphasis on danceable music, Wayne King, his saxophone and his orchestra offer class, imagination and great sound to every son on the LP. My Fair Lady Listed For Aquinas Stage

The first local production of the outstanding Broadway musical hit, My Fair Lady, will take place at Aquinas Institute on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 11, 12 and 13. Local Organist Soloist in Concert Premi

Zenonas Nomeika, organist at St. Andrew's Church, Portland Avenue, and well known to many Rochester area musicians, was the featured soloist with the 90 piece M.L.T. Concert Band in the world premier performance of Jeronimas Kacinskas' Trancendental Expressions, a Concerto for Organ and Band. The performance was presented on May 9, 1964 at the Cambridge campus of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Due to the favorable response given this piece, Mr. Nomeika and the M.L.T. Concert Band again presented it at Melrose, Massachusetts on November 17, 1964 in conjunction with the Melrose Symphony Orchestra. Again this piece was favorably received by both the public and the critics. Further performances are planned for early 1965.

Mr. Nomeika, a pupil of Marcel Dupre at Ecole Normale in Paris, is a native of Lithuania. He came to this country in 1949, and has resided in Rochester since that time, where he is an active church organist, teacher, and recitalist. His concert tours have taken him throughout Western Europe, United States, and Canada.
