## Noon Book Review Ends Fall Series

"A book which raises more questions than it answers — yet, these are questions which need to be faced," concluded Mrs. Donald McConville in reviewing Mary Perkins Ryan's "ARE PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS THE ANSWER?"

Her critique was the last in the fall series of the NOON DAY BOOK REVIEW held at the Catholic Evidence Library.

Among the difficult questions that the author raised, Mrs. McConville mentioned these:

- Is providing a "general education" (all subjects) the essential mission of the Church, or an auxiliary service?
- In channeling so many priests, religious and lay teachers into Catholic schools, which reach about one half of the Catholic young people in school, are we making the best use of our human resources?
- Should not Christian formation be a goal which includes adult Catholics as well as children?
- Does our present school-centered parish effectively touch the lives of the rest of the parishioners who are not in school?

In trying to assess Mrs. Ryan's observations, the reviewer noted:

"Her approach is scholarly and logical. I admire her courage — but I don't agree with her wholeheartedly."

Mrs. McConville's reservations centered on the author's conclusions that other formative forces in the Church could do a more thorough job of Christianizing the young.
