An old Dodge truck, armed with tanks holding 560 gallons of water, provide protection in the desert region. Established with Explorer Scouts among the Indian students, the fire department began with the idea of protecting the 15 buildings maintained at the Franciscan school. Now it has grown to the point where its responsibility include Indian villages of the Gila River Indian Reservation.

Protestant Monk At Rome College

Rome — (NC) — For the first time in Rome's memory, a Protestant clergyman spoke at the Pontifical Urban University, operated by the Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith.

Rev. Roger Schutz, prior of the Protestant monastery at Taizé, France, and a guest at the Vatican Council, said of the event: "We are emerging from a long winter to enjoy the spring of ecumenism."

He was speaking during a conference sponsored by the university's Omnes Gentes (All Peoples) association, whose theme was "Toward New Dimensions of Ecumenism."

"There will still be storms and tempests," he told 700 sem-

"It is also necessary to achieve unity between the Christians of countries of abundance and those of poor countries. In Israel also there were the 'poor of God' who were looking for a Saviour. Today they are the 'poor of Christ' who live in expectation of God."

"It is therefore necessary to formulate a social ecumenical doctrine which aims at sharing all riches at all levels, with the poor of Christ."

Entertainment will be under the direction of Mrs. Marie Novik, which part will be the singing of Christmas Carols.

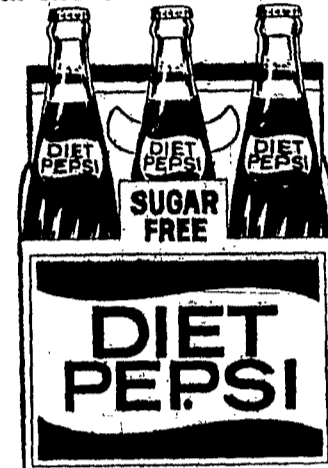
