Vatican City — (NC) — Pope Paul VI wished an early Happy Christmas to a crowd in St. Peter's Square (Dec. 13) and told them to remember that the lamp which brought the Light of Christ into the world is Our Lady.

"Let us pray that she may come to enlighten souls, especially during this preparatory period for Christmas, and that she may give us the comfort of her light."

To make Christmas happy, the Pope continued, "we must review our life in the light of Christ. We need to be enlightened by the Lord in order to understand our lives—who we are, what we must do, where our steps are leading us."

"We remind you that the words of the Gospel in the prologue of St. John tells us that Christ is the Light of the World which comes to illuminate our lives... We have a great need of it because our life is shrouded in uncertainty, from the confusion of our ideas, from not knowing what we must do and think."

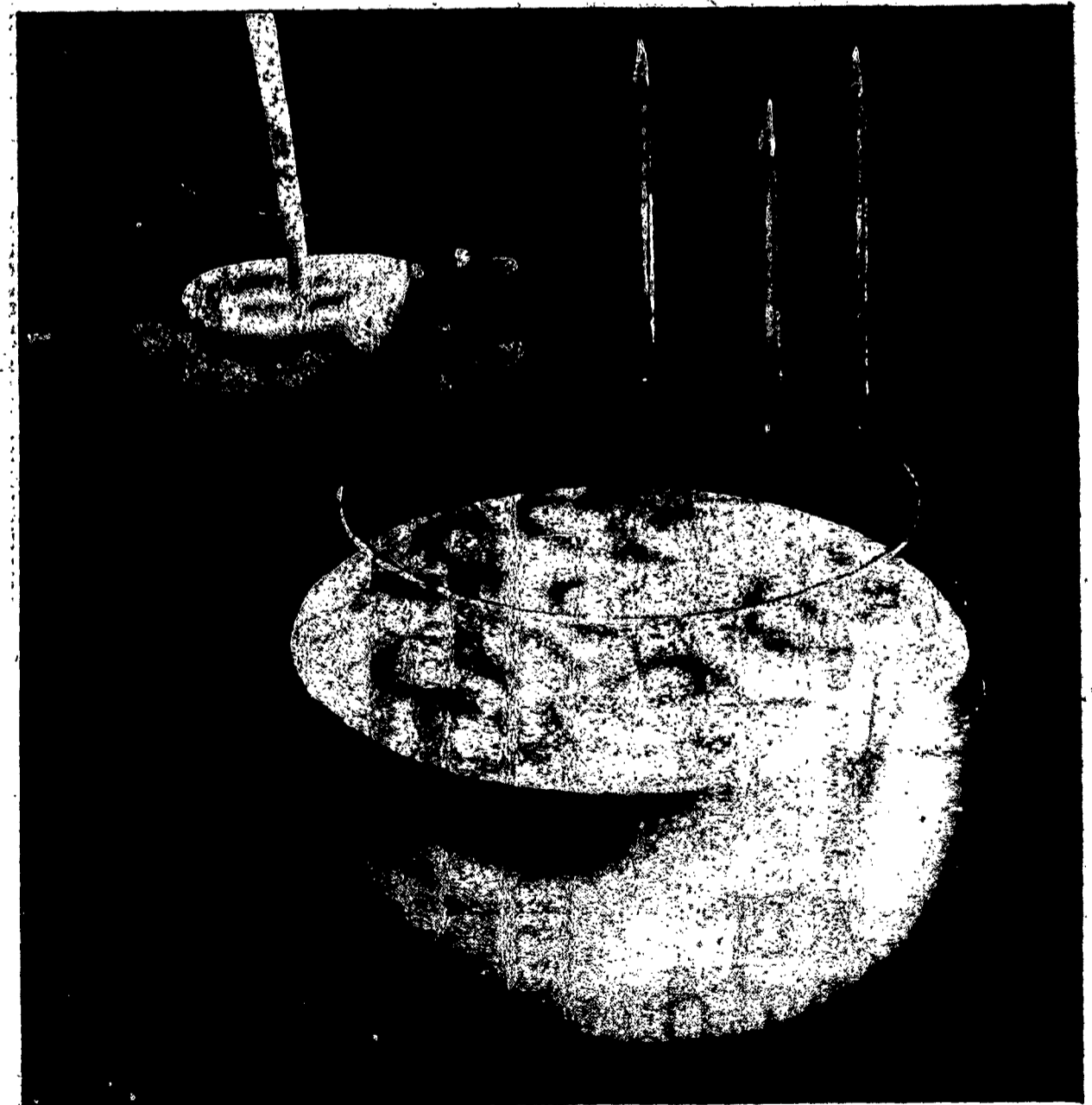
