

Kings Five Tops Olean Team

Last Sunday on the Kings' hardwood, the Bishop Kearney Five defeated the visiting team from Bishop Walsh of Olean, 88-56, bringing the King's first Varsity basketball victory.

The second home game for the Kings, who have had to travel for four of their first six games.

The opening game of their Varsity season was played on their home court when the Kings defeated Naples 41-39.

Highlighting Sunday's game was Bob Case and Walt Sziarlacki, both of whom had a total of ten points, and Tom Hood who scored nine points for the team.

Mike Clark and Don Zintara each had eight points to round off the list of high scorers for the Kings. From the charity strip, Don Zintara hit 4 out of 6, and Walt Sziarlacki and Bob Case both hit 4 out of 5. Teamwise the Kings made 14 out of 22 for a free throw percentage of 63.6, leading the Kings in rebounding was Mike Clark with nine, and close behind were Don Zintara and Walt Sziarlacki with 7 and 6 rebounds respectively to bring the team total of rebounds to 55 against Bishop Walsh's 20.

Two days before on Friday, the Kings had traveled to Bishop Duffy High School in Niagara Falls where they lost 65-53 to the Duffy Rapidsters. Outstanding in that game were Walt Sziarlacki and Bob Case with 15 points each. Mike Clark also added 9 points to the Kings efforts. Leading in rebounding that night were Case and Sziarlacki again with 13 and 14 rebounds respectively bringing the team's total to 25 rebounds. From the foul line Case hit 7 out of 9, Mike Clark 5 out of 8 and Sziarlacki 5 out of 11. The Kings that night made 20 out of 33 for a free throw percentage of 61.

Earlier on Friday night the Kings JV team lost to the Duffy team by a score of 47-75 bringing the JV record to 1-3.

Knights Tip Watertown Face Aquinas Saturday

McQuaid Jesuit High built an 18-point first quarter lead and then extended to an easy win over Watertown, 47-41, last Saturday at McQuaid. The Knights, now 3-1, will be punting for a big number four this Saturday against Aquinas at the war Memorial.

The Little Irish also have a 3-0 mark with an impressive 75-48 win over Watertown among their credits.

Against Watertown, the Knights seemed to be in a 10-0 lead before Tom Greene of Watertown finally broke through a stout McQuaid defense on an outside jump shot with 1:20 left in the first quarter. Gerry Bunnice began the Knights' opening with a tip-in and Tony Leonardo and Mike Spiegel rounded out the first quarter scoring with 10 and 8 points respectively.

Coach Ken Jones, with a 20-1 lead, emptied the McQuaid bench in the second quarter and turned the game over to four juniors and a senior in the final 7 minutes. The closest Watertown came to fighting this game was within 10 points at 35-25, in the third period, and the Knights soon surged back to widen the gap.

Although playing only a little over two-thirds of the game, Leonardo was again the high scorer with 20 points, stuffing

Both victories hung in the balance until the final event. Heavyweight Mark Schiller made McQuaid's 3-point lead stand up by taking a 2-0 decision in the unlimited class, with Marshall needing a pin to overturn the Knights. At Gates-Chili, McQuaid needed a win in the 7-point relay that concluded the meet, and its freestyle quartet of Jim Brunson, Bryan Burns, John Odenbach, and Steve Koller came through.

The wrestlers spread their victory over two days, taking a lead on Thursday before a bomb scare cleared the Marshall gym and coming back on Friday to wrap it up. Scorers for the Knights were Jim Chiaravelli, Paul Berdus and Tim Boomer, all by pins. Dan Iles and Schiller on decisions, and Doug Kremer and Mark Hobson on draws. Chiaravelli's pin came in 1:30, fastest of the day, but considerably slower than the 17-second pin he turned against Monroe for a school record in McQuaid's season opener.

Junior swimmer Dave Mullins was joined by freshman brother John, at Gates and both scored double. Dave, the top scorer in McQuaid's losses to Aquinas and East, took the 200-yard freestyle and the 100 butterfly while John won the 100 freestyle and the individual medley. McQuaid's other winners were Ed Murray in the 100 freestyle, Ed Murray in the 100 backstroke, and Bill Rafferty in the 400 freestyle.

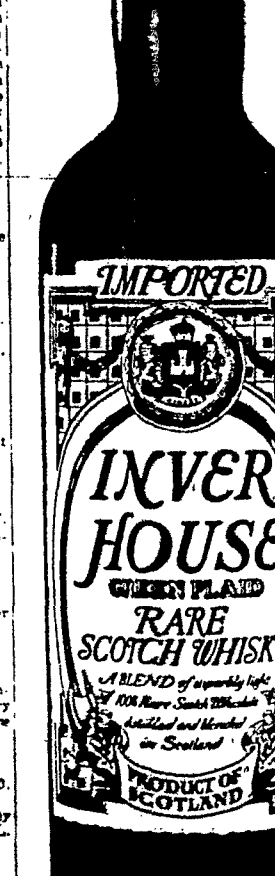

The Bears from Potsdam came to town with a record making unorthodox pressing style of defensive play which baffled the Fishermen throughout the Friday night game. Fisher scored first and held a slim lead until midway in the first period, but by half time was on the short end of a 32-26 score.
