Solemn Requiem Mass was offered for Sister Agnes Marie McGraw on Monday, Dec. 21 in Nazareth Motherhouse Chapel. Sister died December 18, 1964. Celebrant was Father William C. Sison, a cousin of the deceased. He was assisted by Father J. Norman Margrett, deacon, and Father Albert H. Schnack, subdeacon.

A member of the Sisters of St. Joseph for 55 years, Sister Agnes Marie was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh McGraw of Seneca Falls, where she received her early education.

Until she retired last year, Sister taught at St. Ambrose School since 1949.

She taught at St. Francis de Sales High School, Geneva, from 1912 to 1924 and was principal there from 1924 to 1933. Sister was principal of Immaculate Conception School, Ithaca, from 1933 to 1939. She taught at Sacred Heart School from 1939 to 1943 and was principal of Corpus Christi School from 1943 to 1949.

Sister Agnes Marie is survived by several cousins. Burial took place in the Sisters' Plot, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

### William Farley Priest, Once Red Victim, Funeral Rites Dies; Relatives Here

A Solemn Requiem Mass for William Francis Farley was offered at Corpus Christi Church on Friday, Dec. 18, by Msgr. John E. Maney, celebrant; Father Albert L. Belmonte, deacon, and Father Robert A. Mens, subdeacon.

Mr. Farley, who lived at 255 Cedarwood Ter., suffered a heart attack and died suddenly Monday evening, Dec. 14.

Mr. Farley worked for the New York State Highway Dept. for over thirty years. He was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Holy Name Society of Corpus Christi Church.

Surviving are his wife, Gertrude, one son, William E. Farley, two sisters, Mrs. Alma Farrell of Caledonia, N.Y., and Mrs. Evelyn Carroll, four grandchildren, several nieces and nephews.

Msgr. Maney gave the blessing at the grave at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

A missionary priest who was once a prisoner of the Chinese Communists died suddenly at his parish in Ireland earlier this month, relatives in Rochester have just learned.

Vincenian Father Maurice Kavanaugh, 67, a native of Ireland who visited Rochester in 1953 after 14 months of imprisonment and torture, died Dec. 12, 1964.

In a letter written a few days before his death, he said he "never felt better." He was headmaster of St. Kevin's College at Glenarts Castle, Arklow, Wicklow.

He was arrested in 1951 in Peking, charged as a spy and secret agent, subjected to repeated questionings, including one uninterrupted period of 32 hours during which he had to stand the whole time.

He was also forced to squat for 84 hours with a halter around his neck to jerk him erect whenever he fell from exhaustion.

He became critically ill and taken to a hospital. After recovering he was left relatively free from questioning but kept

under constant guard. He reported he said the Rosary as many as sixty times a day for the remaining nine months period. The Chinese Reds expelled him in 1952.

HIS RELATIVES in the Rochester area include cousins Patrick Kavanaugh, 25 Oriole St., Peter Kavanaugh of Lynnet St., Mrs. Mary Hickey of Ellicott Ave., Mrs. John Noble of Knickerbocker Ave., Mrs. Joseph Byrnes of Glendale Park, Willis Kavanaugh of Plisford and former Rochester Police Chief Andrew J. Kavanaugh who recently retired as Public Safety Commissioner of Wilmington, Delaware.

Father Kavanaugh is also survived by a brother, Andrew, who is a priest in Ireland and had also been a missionary in China. Funeral rites were held Monday, Dec. 21, in Dublin.
