Henry Lockwood won first place in the American Legion oratorical eliminations held at Notre Dame on Dec. 17, and will represent the school at the county contest to be held at Elmira College Jan. 18.

Henry spoke on the topic "For What Was the Constitution Actually Designed?" He cited a challenge of Patrick Henry to rule ourselves with strength and courage; almost the same challenge that President Kennedy gave to us less than four years ago. Second place winner was Michael Murphy, third place, Rosalie Fiori, fourth, William Cady.

Fifteen, ten and five dollar awards were presented to the winning speakers by Mr. John Gardner, representing the American Legion. Each contestant also received the American Legion Oratorical Medal.

The boys' schola, and English classes taught by Sister M. Sarto and Sister Marie Jose presented a Christmas program Dec. 21 in the auditorium. Choral speech consisting of original poetry, passages from the gospel and excerpts from the book "A Woman Wrapped in Silence," made up the main part of the script. Traditional Christmas music was presented by the choral groups, and the Nativity tableau was depicted by the students, with Maryanne Price as the Virgin Mary and John Donahue as St. Joseph. The band under the direction of Mr. Philip Layton played as the students entered the auditorium.

Sister Mary Declan was hostess this week at the principal's reception for Notre Dame graduates, held in the cafeteria after the Coming-East-ND basketball game.

Commenting on the program, Sister Declan stated: "We like to provide an opportunity for our graduates to meet one another as well as the faculty during the holiday season. We always look forward to the graduates' homecoming."

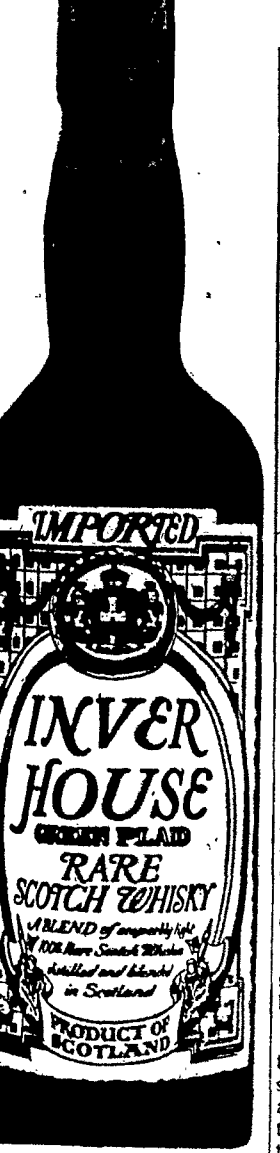
