Notre Dame's Crusaders started the new year off right with a surprising 56-53 victory over intra-city rival Southside of Elmira Jan. 5. The Crusaders, sparked by Jack Kent's hot hand in the second half and big Mike Malone's rebounding, overcame a 26-21 halftime deficit to post their third win in five games. Kent did most of his scoring the second half, hitting on nine of 16 from the field, scoring 21 points. Bob McGurgan and Bob Huddle were key men in the Notre Dame defense. McGurgan stole several passes and scored 12

points, while Huddle blocked shots and helped out in the rebound department.

Southside's Tom Morrissey kept the Green Hornets of Southside in the game until the final buzzer, but his 20 point performance wasn't enough to stop the surging Crusaders.

In the preliminary contest, Southside's junior varsity downed the Little Crusaders, 54-40. Notre Dame's Joel Ramich topped the losers with 12 points.

Notre Dame's wrestling team made its best showing to date on the Crusader mats Thursday night, Jan. 7, though Trumansburg wrestlers captured the final four matches and defeated ND 28-20.

Notre Dame's Larry Hamilton, a 145 pounder, decided Ron White for his 14th consecutive win and his fourth this season.

Bill Lyman and Tim Coggins pinned their Trumansburg opponents in the 95 and 122 pound classes, respectively. Don McDonald and Trumansburg's Mike Pittman at 120, and Gary Murchough and Gerry Giroux at 133, scored draws.

Look-Alike Chaplains Lead Parallel Lives

Take the case of the parishioner who found himself talking to (Chaplain) Lt. Col. Joseph Gefell when he thought he was talking to (Chaplain) Lt. Col. Gerard Gefell and you have the Army's version of the problem of the local school teacher with a set of identical twins in her class.

That the Fathers Gefell were stationed together at Fort Richardson, Alaska from 1956 to 1958 and at Ft. Bragg, N.C. from 1958 to 1961 is only one of the many paralleling events in their lives. They have served in Korea and Father Gerard has been in Germany. Father Joseph will go to Germany next summer.

Both brothers are graduates of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Rochester. They were both ordained in 1941 and then applied for commissions as U.S. Army chaplains.

Only in their first years in the Army did their careers fail to parallel. Father Joseph entered the Army in 1945 and served until 1947. He reentered in 1951. Father Gerard entered the Army in the 1948 buildup.

Then came the years together at Ft. Richardson and Ft. Bragg. Both chaplains received their senior paratrooper wings in January, 1960 and were promoted to their present rank in July, 1962. Father Gerard received his promotion just five days before Father Joseph.
