

Microfilm Grant Made To Nazareth College

Nazareth College library has received a grant from the Association of College and Research Libraries, a division of the American Library Association. The grant made to the Nazareth library was one of 162 selected from among 547 applicants. It will consist of a Mark VII Microcard reader and selected microcards. The equipment is valued at approximately \$1,000.

Forty-four grants of funds and 113 of equipment were made to college and university libraries in addition to five fund grants to individuals for research projects. Total value of the grants is approximately \$138,500.

The ACRL grants program was initiated in 1955. The program is directed toward the general needs of private colleges and universities for developing their library collections, improving the quality of library service to higher education through fundamental research librarianship, and otherwise aiding in the best use of the most modern teaching and learning materials.

Mercy Girls To Study In France This Summer

"Parlez-vous francais?"

Fifteen Mercy High School students who plan to study at Vichy, France, this summer will be able to answer with a confident "oui" next September. The girls will study French conversation and culture at the Institut Culturel International de Vichy, a special school for foreign students maintained by the American Institute for Foreign Study.

Sister Mary Maureen, head of Mercy's language department, initiated and arranged the trip, which is sponsored by the American Institute. It is the first foreign-study program ever to be tried at Mercy. Departure date is June 28 and the return will be August 4.

Participants in the program are sophomores Margaret Mer-

cado, Loralee Sparacino, and Cheryl Klueh; juniors Mary Lou Abbott, Alice Boyce, Maureen Brady, Nancy Cozzolino, Margaret Gilman, Kathy Gill, Mary Hayes, Kathy Keating, Ann Meng, and Jane Wennerstrom; and seniors Marie Fessenden and Janice Hart. They will be accompanied by Sister Maureen.

At the Institut, classes, taught by instructors from the University of Louraine, will run from 8:30 to 12:30 in the morning. Optional lectures will be available in the afternoon. From this program more than one year's equivalent experience in French can be acquired.

Sister Maureen said that, in comparing Vichy to the other locations offered by the program, she found it gave students the greatest opportunities for enrichment.

Before settling in France the travelers will spend four days in London sightseeing.


