

Giant Censer To Overhang Pilgrims

Santiago de Compostela (NC) — A gigantic silver-plated censer — a "botafumeiro" — weighing 175 pounds will swing like a giant pendulum over the heads of pilgrims at ceremonies in the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela during Spain's Holy Year of 1965.

Its installation recalls that the first such censer was placed there in 1321 and was replaced after more than six centuries by others, one of them made of heavy silver and another of iron, fastened by chains and swinging from the ceiling of the nave.

In the year 1499, on July 25, the feast day of St. James the Apostle, patron of Spain, the botafumeiro in the cathedral ripped loose and fell. But nobody was hurt in the congregation, which included Princess Catherine of Aragon, later the wife of England's King Henry VIII. A similar mishap occurred on May 23, 1822, when the giant vessel plummeted through a stage set up for religious pageants marking the feast of Corpus Christi. There were no injuries.

Five Years Toll in Congo Nearly 100 Missioners

Rome — (RNS) — Ninety-five Catholic missionary priests and religious have been killed by rebel forces in the Congo since 1960, according to the latest statistics released here.

The figures were made public by Fides, news agency of the International Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which noted that the list of those slain included one bishop. He was Bishop Joseph Pierre Albert Wittelbols of Wamba, Belgian-born member of the Priests of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The prelate was among 25 to 30 white hostages massacred near Wamba in December.

Fides said the other victims of the Congolese rebel forces included 59 priests, 13 Brothers and 22 nuns, of Belgian, Dutch, Italian, German and American nationality.

It said slain missionaries were members of the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, the Passionists, the White Fathers, the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, the Oblates of the Sacred Heart and the African Missions of Verona (Italy).

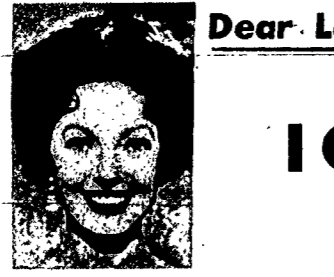
