**St. Joseph Nuns Conduct Day of Recollection**

On Sunday, January 17, at Nazareth College, sixty-one women attended the second Day of Recollection given by the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Rochester.

Last Spring, at the request of the Program Committee of the Rosary Society at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, the Sisters agreed to conduct a Day of Recollection for them. So profitable and enjoyable was the venture for both the Sisters and those who attended, that the former readily agreed to hold another such day when asked to do so again this year. Mrs. Warren Gaeger and Mrs. Patrick Gaffney of Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish joined Mrs. Porter Homer and Mrs. F. Leslie Dullinger of Lourdes Parish in making the arrangements for their Altar Society members who wished to attend.

The day's theme was "The Christian Woman in the Renewal." After a welcome given to the group by Sister Helen Daniel, President of Nazareth College, Sister Dorothy Ellen, Vice-Principal of St. Agnes High School, spoke on "The Fully Mature Christian Woman." This conference was followed by the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered by the Reverend Cieran Ryan from Queen of Peace Parish.

During lunch, the participants discussed topics ranging from the Montessori teaching methods to Chardin's Future of Man. The second conference, given by Sister Claudia, director of liturgy at St. Agnes High School, was on "The Roles Woman," and the last speaker was Sister Mary Lourdes of the Theology Department of Nazareth College, whose topic was "The Christian Woman and Sacramentality."

A Bible service prepared and explained by Sister Joan Margaret, also of the college theology department, emphasized through prayers and readings from Holy Scripture the preeminence of love in the life of all Christians.

The Reverend James F. Slattery, pastor of Our Lady Queen of Peace parish, concluded the day's exercises with Benediction. Once again the response of all participants was most enthusiastic, and other such days are already anticipated, according to Sister Mary John, Public Relations Director for the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester, who was in charge of the arrangements for the day.
