The Catholics joined with some 30 members of a local group called Concerned Citizens. The priests who participated in the picketing were Fathers Bruce Bryolly and Richard A. Reissman, both of Wilmington.

A spokesman for the Catholic Interracial Council said the group usually works in "a quiet manner" but decided to picket "to help in a very just cause."

**High School Forensics**

Two years of debate in National Forensic League Congresses in Western New York could not deny passing a bill providing equal aid to all students attending accredited schools.

Such a bill introduced by Aquinas Institute and sponsored by Senator Robert Craig was passed in the Winter Congress at the Monroe County Hall of Justice January 23. The final vote was thirty-four to ten.

In other legislation the debate students passed a bill calling for aid to counter-revolutionaries inside Cuba and defeated two bills on nationalizing the railroads and establishing residency requirement for candidates to the U.S. Senate.

The aid to all students in accredited schools at all levels of education caused the longest afternoon session as the bill had been up for discussion at previous congresses.

Aquinas with the largest debate squad in New York State was allotted ten student representatives who voted for the bill. They were aided by McQuaid's seven votes, several from Irondequoit and several from R. L. Thomas High School. Other schools attending were from Utica, Syracuse and Buffalo.

The Monroe County Board of Supervisors through County Manager Gordon A. Howe provides the Hall of Justice for the NFL Congresses and has done so since the Fall Congress of 1963. Aquinas Institute hosts the congresses.

**People Like To See Mass**

Burlington, Vt. (NC) — The Mass offered facing the people has received praise from all over Vermont. Bishop Robert F. Joyce of Burlington reported. The prelate also said the Mass is being offered in the language of the individual parish. English is used in most Vermont parishes, but in two predominantly Polish parishes and several French parishes, the Mass is permitted in those languages.

The bishop said his program for Mass for house-confined Catholics at least twice a year has been received favorably.

"Many sick and aged people haven't been able to attend Mass for quite a while. Bringing the Mass to them has brought them a lot of joy," the bishops said.

Other entries are Fordham University, City College of New York, New York University, Columbia University, and the defending champion, Colgate University.

A public speaking contest for individuals will be conducted, in addition to team debate competition on the topic: "Government should institute a national program of public works for the unemployed." The debates will be open to the public.
