

# LBJ School Plan Feasible

New York — (RNS) — Parochial and other private school children and other private school children in New York State could legally participate in President Johnson's proposed federal program to aid education, despite the state constitution's ban against use of public funds for non-public schools.

This opinion was expressed by Dr. James E. Allen, Jr., state commissioner of education, following the President's message to Congress calling for federal education grants to embrace public and private elementary and secondary school children.

The President asked for supplementary education centers, shared services or other special educational projects — common to all — and the purchase of books for school libraries and students.

Dr. Allen said that federal funds to accomplish the Administration's aims "could be channeled through the state, for parochial school children."

"The state," he explained, "would be only an administrative agency, and not a determining one. It would not determine where the money was going, but only follow the recommendations of the federal government."

Dr. Allen's interpretation was seen as giving an impetus to the shared time plan, under which, parochial children take some non-religious courses in public schools under supervision of public school authorities.

Although no such program exists in New York State so far, it has been started in at least 35 other states in some form or another. If Congress approves the Administration's program, it is expected that Roman Catholic and other church-related schools will seek to set up pilot shared time projects with public school officials.

## All New Altars Face People

Lisbon — (CNC) — The Portuguese hierarchy has directed that all new churches constructed in this country must have their altar tables erected free of the church wall, so that Mass can be celebrated facing the congregation. The same requirement holds true for old churches being rebuilt or renovated.

This was made public with the release here of the full text of the new liturgical instructions concerning the changes to go into effect in public worship on March 7, the first Sunday of Lent.

The instruction provides for the use of Portuguese instead of Latin in virtually all the readings and prayers recited aloud, but not the Preface. It does, however, grant the use of the vernacular for the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion, thus going beyond the provisions in the US, and some other countries.

## Laymen Named As Consultors

Sarasota, Spain — (NS) — A diocesan pastoral council, made up of priests and laymen, will aid Archbishop Pedro Castero Cadrado of Sarasota in the spiritual and administrative government of the archdiocese.

The appointment of the council coincided with the reorganization of the diocesan curia. The archbishop appointed two general vicars, one for administrative tasks and the other for pastoral tasks. He also established two general secretariats, the first for social action and the second for education and the organization of the apostolate.

## Red Cross Seeks Drivers

The local chapter of the Red Cross announced last week that there is a need for Motor Service Drivers. Mr. D. Lawrence Herman, volunteer Chairman of the Motor Service, said that both men and women volunteers are needed for morning, afternoon, and evening hours for a variety of assignments.

These include: the blind children's "fun program" of the Association for the Blind; providing transportation for organizations such as our community settlement houses, the Cerebral Palsy Association, and nursing homes; also there is the vital service of delivering blood to the hospitals.

Anyone possessing a senior New York State driver's license and a good driving record is eligible. Retired men and women, as well as working people, are encouraged to join. Interviews will be given: Thursdays, Feb. 4 and 11, and Fridays, Feb. 5 and 12, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 1 to 3 p.m. Interviews are also being scheduled for Saturdays, Feb. 13 and 20, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.
