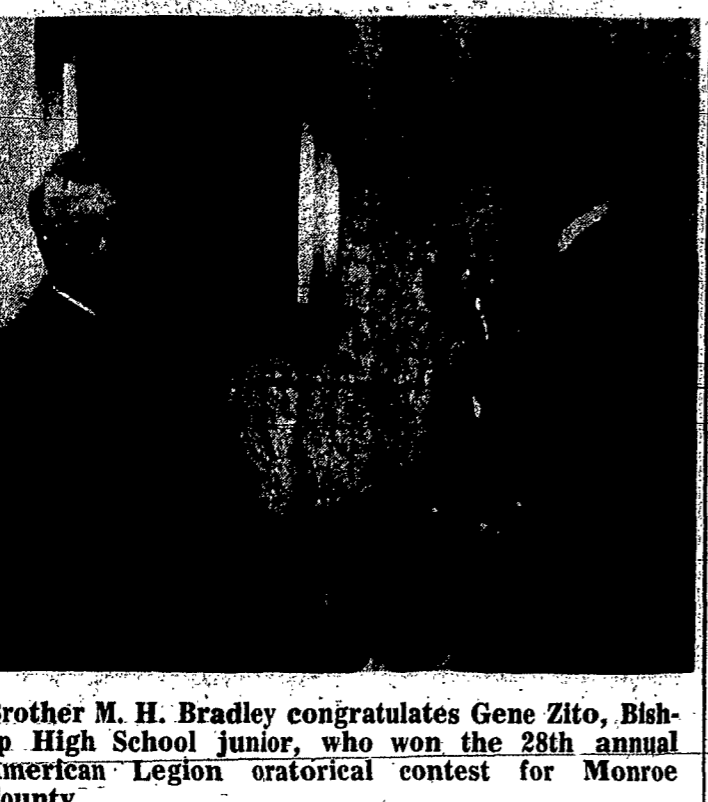

Kearney High Student Wins Legion Contest

Miss Sullivan active in local, state and national banking completed 28 years of service, Jan. 20. Miss Sullivan joined Community Savings Bank in 1938 as advertising manager; was named public relations director in 1947 and elected assistant vice president in January 1952. Among her ideas were the use of receptionists in place of guards, Ladies Day and Valentine gifts for depositors. She is active in Catholic circles being a member of the Catholic Women's Club, Ladies of Blessed Sacrament Society, the Daily Mass League and Cencle Retreat League. In her banking career, Miss Sullivan has recorded many "firsts". She was one of the first four bank women in the country graduated from School of Financial Public Relations at Northwestern University, the first woman elected to head the Public Relations Force of Savings Banks' Association of New York State; first woman elected president of Rochester Chapter, Public Relations Society of America. Miss Sullivan has held high offices in banking and business groups and has spoken at national, state and local conventions and forums on banking education, public relations and advertising.

Open House Slated By Geneva 3rd Order

Religious instruction for Retarded Children are conducted throughout the year and this project will be explained by Miss Florence Hoag. She will present the second semester's schedule of activities and also, by demonstration with an overhead projector, present a sample lesson.
