Aquinas Downs Canandaigua

Aquinas Institute's basketball team, fresh from a landslide victory over Canandaigua Academy last Saturday night, will return to action this weekend with two road games, tonight against Franklin and tomorrow night against East Rochester.

The Irish, 10 and 3 on the season, will have their hands full tonight and tomorrow. Franklin is an improving club and is fresh from an upset victory over McQuaid. East Rochester has a perfect record, including a 50-41 win over Aquinas last month.

Aquinas showed a well-balanced attack by pinning a decisive 84-51 loss on Canandaigua before a capacity crowd in the Aquinas gymnasium last weekend.

Utilizing a decided height advantage, some sharpshooting by John Laveck, strong rebounding by Wayne Desbrow and the scoring heroics of coach Jack Kelly's secret weapon, diminutive Charlie Pilato, the Irish breezed to their tenth win.

Aquinas jumped to an early 17-9 lead at the end of the first eight minutes of action as all starters jumped into the scoring column.

The second period was a carbon copy of the first. Canandaigua battled determinedly, but couldn't match Aquinas' accuracy from the field or its rebounding strength. The home towners maintained their comfortable lead and went off the floor at halftime with a 33-20 advantage.
