Japan Missionary Speaks At Divine Word Seminary

Rev. Alphonse Hotze, S.V.D., Litt. D., Ph.D., a Divine Word Missionary now on the faculty of the Catholic University of Nagoya (Nanzan University), spoke to the assembly at Divine Word Seminary, Conesus on Jan. 29.

FATHER HOTZE was ordained to the priesthood in 1937, obtained his doctorate in English and now teaches on the faculty at Nanzan University.

Nanzan University, located in Nagoya, is the second largest Catholic University in Japan with a student body of 6,000. Of these 250 are Catholics. Connected with the University, Divine Word Missionaries conduct a boys' high school and a girls' high school.

Nanzan University is now undergoing an extensive expansion program in order to keep the standards required for a good University in Japan where higher education is highly valued.

Father Hotze, from Leopold, Missouri, is one of three brothers who are Divine Word Missionary priests. His two other brothers are Rev. Leo Hotze, S.V.D., now provincial of the Eastern Province of the Divine Word Missionaries in the United States, and Rev. Clement Hotze, S.V.D., territorial superior in Ghana, Africa.
