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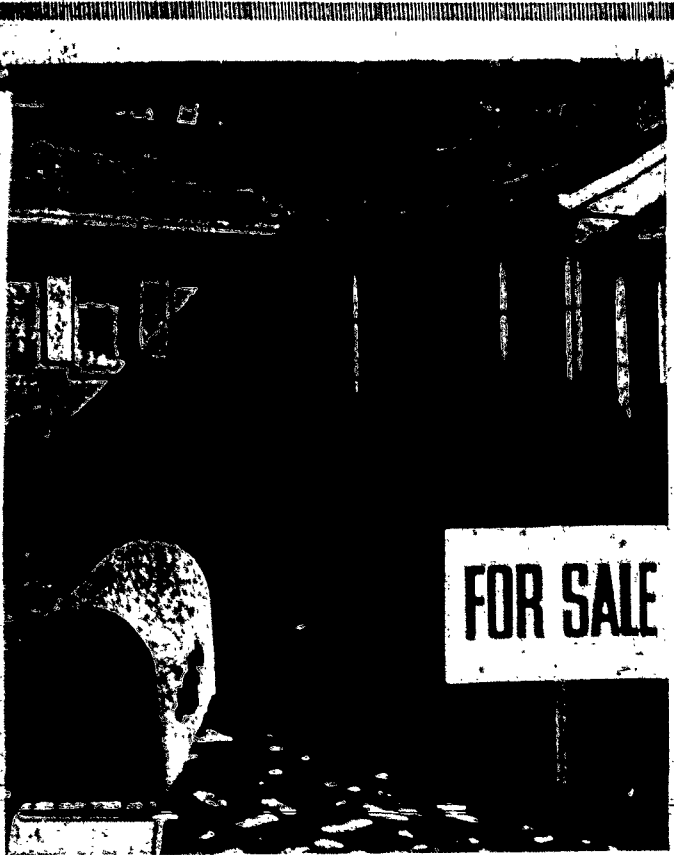

I Had a Ball

Mercury Records is heading full-steam into the competition with news that the firm had obtained recording rights to The Yearling, forthcoming musical drama based on the best-selling Pulitzer Prize winning novel of the same name. And already in record shops throughout the country is the original Broadway-cast recording of I Had a Ball.

The rollicking comedy broke the all-time attendance at the 50 year old Martin Beck Theatre recently with a fine cast headed by Buddy Hackett, Richard Kiley and Karen Morrow. Words and music by Jack Lawrence and Stan Freeman are definitely contagious.

Richard Kiley and Karen Morrow are particularly impressive and a fine performance is turned in by Luba Lisa. Buddy Hackett is his usual self with his side-of-the-mouth talking and singing. All-in-all the album offers fascinating music that you'll find yourself humming for weeks to come. Tunes include The Other Half of Me, I've Got Everything, I Want Almost and many others — all top-notch. Heading the list are Faith, Addie's At It Again, and Coney Island, U.S.A.

Sam (The Man) Taylor, master of the tenor saxophone, offers a stereo spectacular on his new Decca release, Somewhere in the Night, with some excellent orchestral accompaniment.

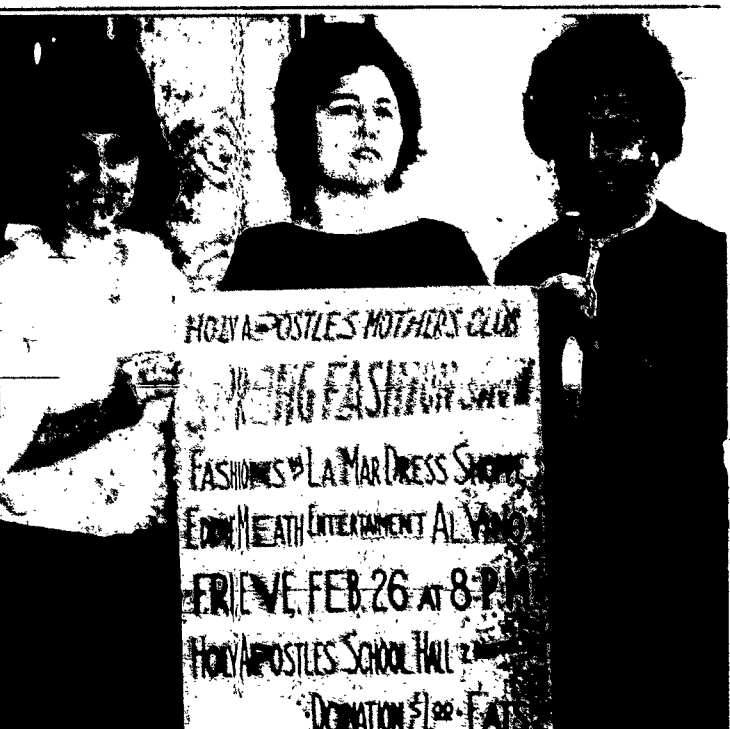

The name and talents of the late Buddy Holly lives on through his many Coral recordings. In his latest album, Holly in the Hills, his unmistakable talents are heard in a group of songs recorded in 1955, four years before his death.

The Crickets join him on Fool's Paradise and Lonesome Tears while his long-time friend Bob Montgomery is heard on many of the others. Other tunes include You and I Are Through, Soft Place in My Heart and I Wanna Play House with You.

A special feature of I Had a Ball is Buddy Hackett's post-curtain monologues in which he captures many of his best one-liners. How You Do on the Coral label has Buddy doing many of the bits that he has made famous on television and in smart supper clubs across the country.

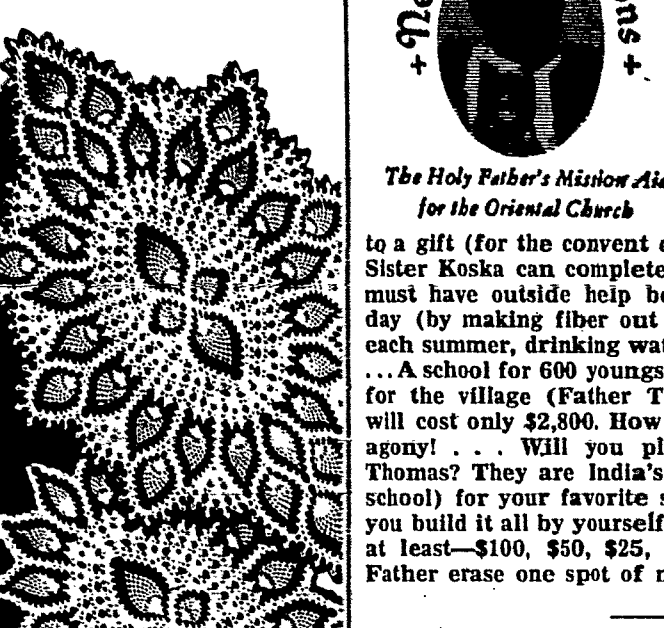

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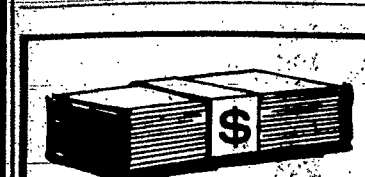

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INDIA'S HOPE: SISTER KOSKA
THE HAUNTING EYES OF A HUNGRY CHILD LOOK LEADENLY AT SISTER KOSKA. In Ku-mara-kom, a village in India's backwaters, she is God's answer to the poor... The American visitor is moved to anger, then to tears. He attends the funeral of a newborn baby. For lack of simple care, the mother died as well... "There is no need for this hunger, suffering, sorrow," you hear Sister Koska say. "These people need proper instruction, that's all. We Sisters are here to teach them."... The mud-brick hovel the Sisters live in will be replaced this year, thanks to a gift (for the convent chapel) from a reader of this column. Sister Koska can complete the convent for \$900 more... She must have outside help because the village earns only 21c a day (by making fiber out of coconut husks). For five months each summer, drinking water (from the village well) is rationed... A school for 600 youngsters can be built for \$3,200. A church for the village (Father Thomas Kanfirathinkal, 41, is pastor) will cost only \$2,800. How little it will take to wipe out human agony! Will you please help Sister Koska and Father Thomas? They are India's hope... Name the church (or the school) for your favorite saint, in your loved one's memory, if you build it all by yourself. Send as much as you can, something at least—\$100, \$50, \$25, \$5, \$2. You'll be helping the Holy Father erase one spot of misery!
