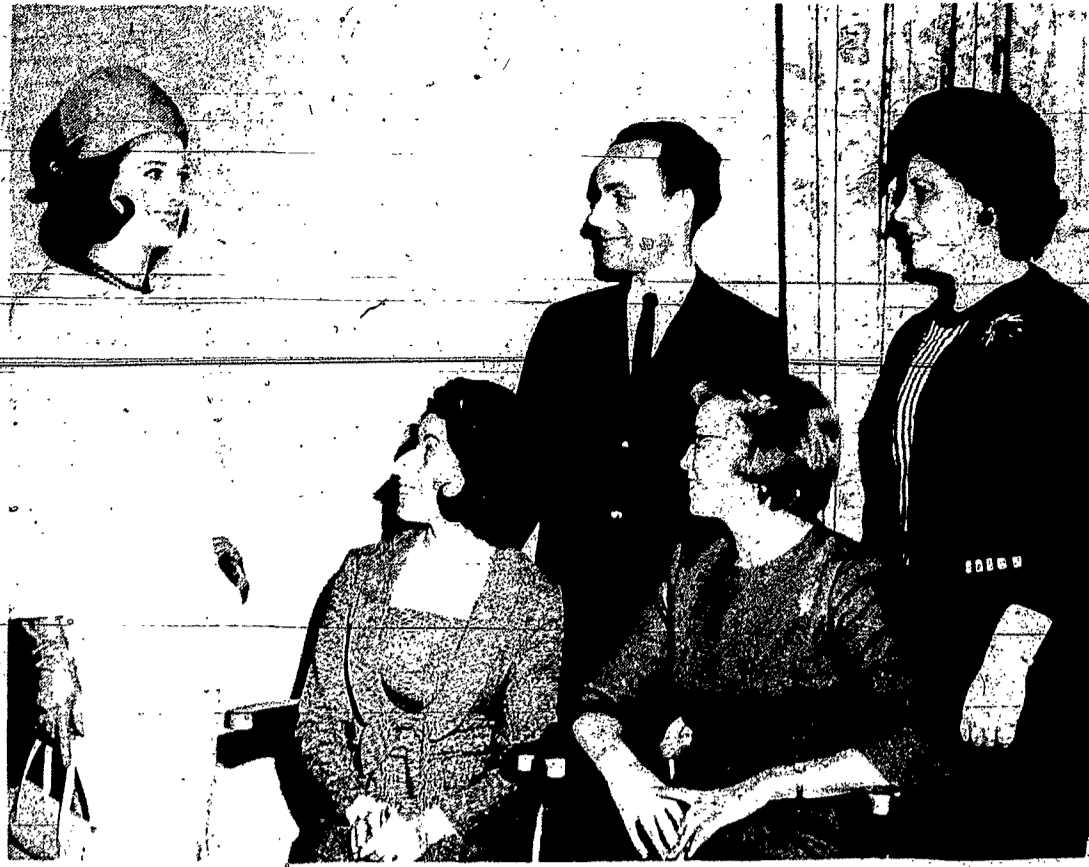




Ready For Scout Sunday
