## Secretaries Hold Seminar at Fisher

A secretarial seminar on "Communications in Today's World," sponsored by the Flower City chapter of the National Secretaries Association (NSA) will be held at St. John Fisher College on Saturday, Feb. 27.

Some 200 secretaries from the Rochester area, representatives of other NSA chapters in New York State, as well as secretarial students and instructors from area colleges are expected to attend.

Professional improvement for secretaries and future secretaries is the overall aim of the seminar, which has attracted several stimulating speakers. They include the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher college, who will open the afternoon session with a talk on "Where Are We Going — and When?"

Chairman Mildred M. Easton will open the program at 9 a.m. Following a welcoming address by Miss Mariene R. Boyle, Chapter president, Mrs. Madeline W. Schmidt, Head of Career Program in Business at Monroe Community College, will instruct her hearers on "Your Prose is Showing!"

She will be followed by Dr. William R. Smith, Xerox director of Personnel Development, speaking on "Communications in the Office." R.I.T.'s chairman of Language and Literature, Robert G. Koch, will present "Our Many Toned World — Problems of International Communications," at 11:15 a.m.

Final presentation in the afternoon will fall to William J. Adams, program director, WHECTV, who will discuss "Television — The Awakening Giant."

All area secretaries are invited and need not necessarily be members of the NSA. For special students, there will be a special student fee.

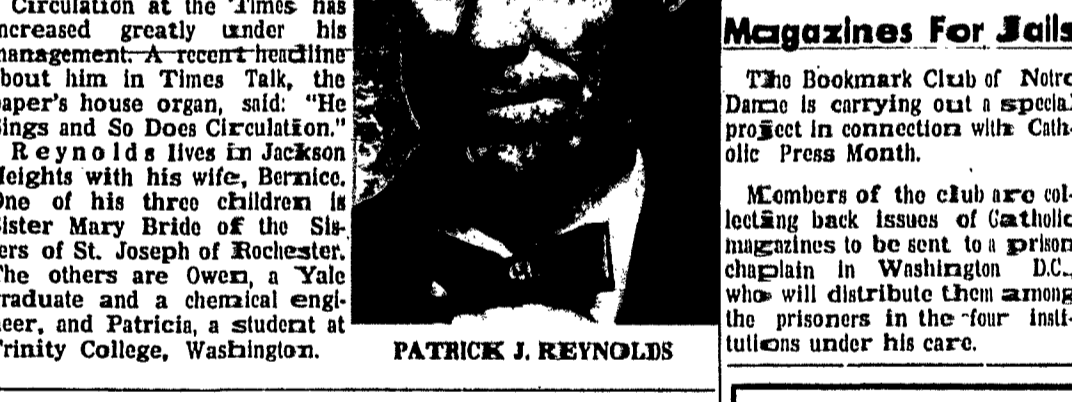
## Bake Sale Aids Library Fund

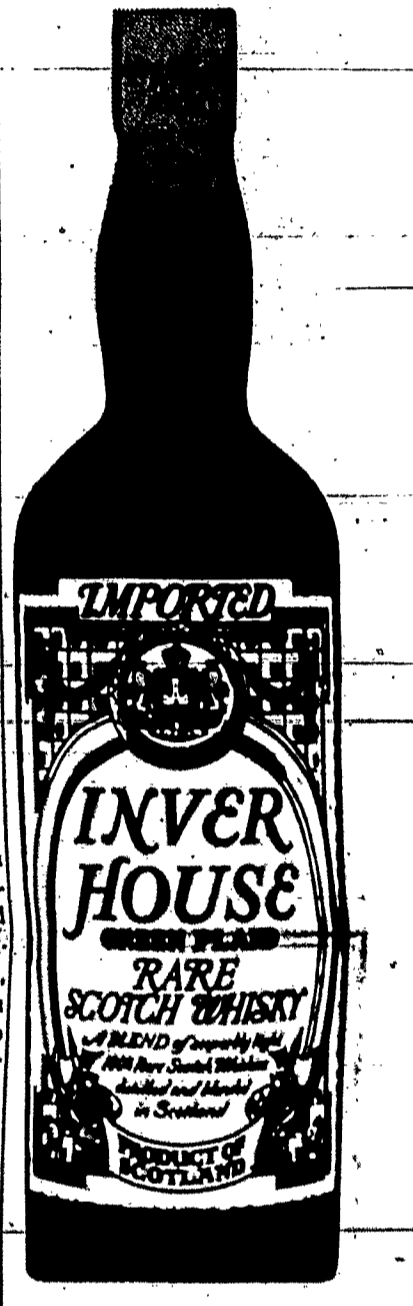
