Miss Susan Van Bell was maid of honor and best man was Richard Ball. Ushers were Michael Jarzabek and Gerald Rewers.



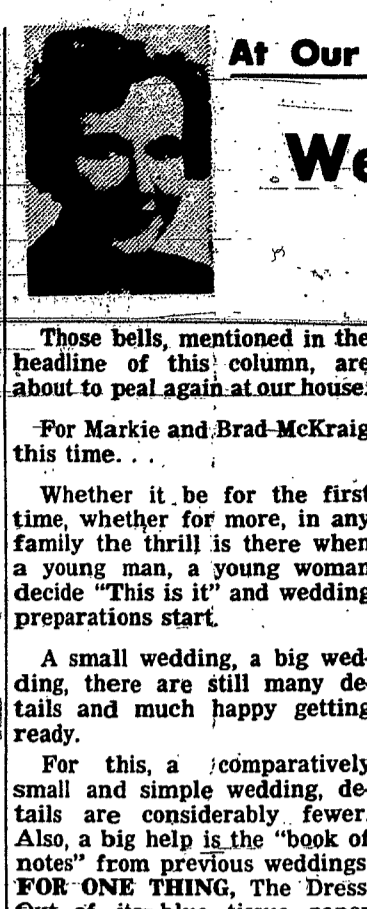
