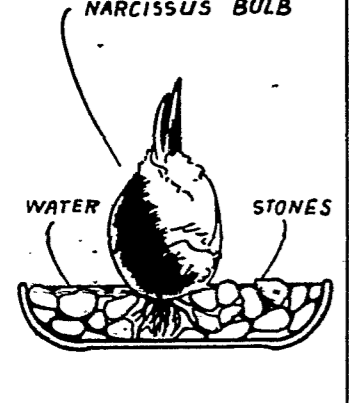

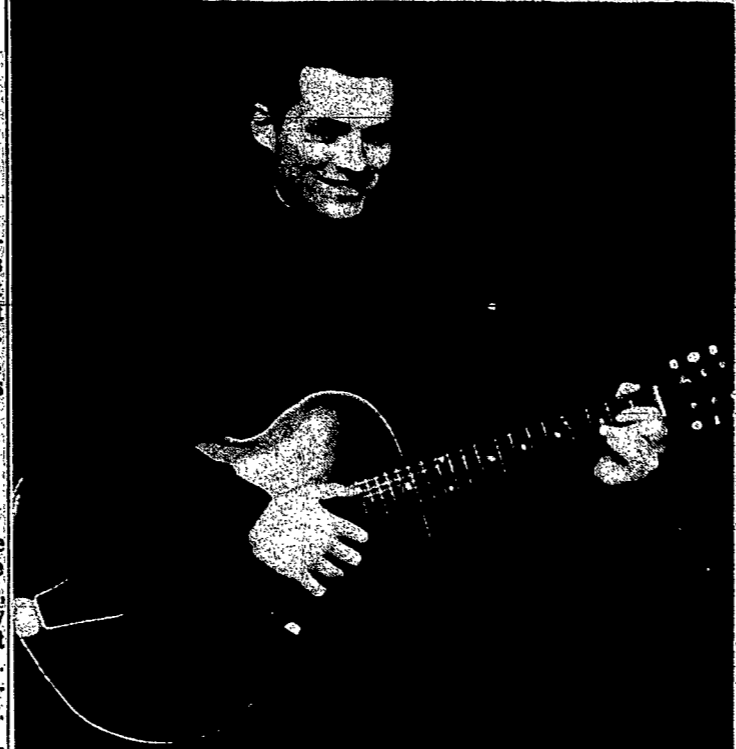

## Priest-Song Writer Leads Carmel Singers

Things We Share. These appearances marked another milestone for this group which is becoming ever more popular around the Finger Lakes region.

The group consists of 15 boys and 12 girls—all members of Mount Carmel High School, Auburn, which is run by the Carmelite Fathers. Father Kenneth started the group in September-1963, when he was first appointed to Mount Carmel. Although the group appears mainly at functions held at Mount Carmel, they have also performed at the Auburn Schine Theater, the Auburn Community College and at the Genoa Fingerlakes Festival.

They usually distribute sing-along sheets to their audiences and then intersperse group singing with solos or duets by members of the group. Father Kenneth introduces each song in his youthful manner and often charms the audience with a story or two.

Last summer the group recorded its first 45 rpm record, featuring two of Father Kenneth's own compositions—"Why Must It Be" (the thoughts of a soldier awaiting death in a foxhole) and "All Day Long" (the song of a plow-boy who is soon to be married).
