

Knights Edge Aquinas Seek Fourth Cage Title

Defending champion McQuaid Jesuit High, a narrow 59-55 winner over Aquinas in a diocesan tournament semi-final game at the War Memorial last Saturday, goes after its fourth tournament title this Sunday afternoon at the U. of Rochester Palestra.

The Knights' opponents in the championship game will be either DeSales of Geneva or Notre Dame of Elmira, both of whom won quarter-final games over Padua High and Mt. Carmel of Auburn, respectively, last weekend. (Those two teams clashed at Geneva on Wednesday night, after press deadline.)

Prior to the final game, Aquinas will play the DeSales-Notre Dame loser for third place honors.

Aquinas gave it the big effort in its semi-final encounter with McQuaid. Down by 10 points late in the second quarter, the Little Irish chipped away at that lead and closed to within 37-35 on Tom Sullivan's layup with 1:30 left in the third period.

McQuaid drew away again on Tony Leonardo's long jump shot

and Lance Compa's foul shot, but the Irish came back, this time knotting the count at 45-45 when Tom Dudley converted Sullivan's assist on a fast break with 5:20 to go in the game.

For the next four minutes, though, McQuaid outscored the Irish, 9-1, to take a decisive 54-45 edge. Center Gerry Bunce, who had been a key reserve in last year's tournament victory, did it again with a 3-point rebounding on Leonardo's miss and tacking on the foul try for a 49-45 McQuaid lead. After Jim Caverly had cashed a foul for Aquinas, Bunce dropped in another free throw and fed John Stanley underneath for a layup that put the count at 51-46.

Mike Spiegel, who had gone scoreless, then jumped in a jump shot and a foul for an 51-46 spread and came through with a layup on his own foul miss to make it 54-48 with a little over a minute to go.

Aquinas surged back again, though, and Caverly's jump shot finally closed the gap to 57-55 with 25 seconds left. Something memorable in Aquinas-McQuaid

finishes seemed in the making, but the Irish never got another shot at the basket. Fouling in their attempts to get the ball, Jack Kelly's boys saw Leonardo go to the line with 8 seconds left and put the clinching point in. When he missed his second attempt, McQuaid grabbed the rebound and Compa finished off the scoring with a foul shot just before the buzzer.

For Ken Jones's veteran team, the victory marked their fourth straight over Aquinas and McQuaid's sixth in the 11-game series. Leonardo and Stanley set the scoring pace with 21 and 13, while Dudley's 19 topped Aquinas.

Cardinals Trounce Bp. Kearney 56-35

Cardinal Mooney's Cardinals, displaying excellent ballhandling, a devastating fast break, and an aggressive style of play, treated 5,000 to a 56-35 trouncing of their arch-rivals, the Kings of Bishop Kearney last Saturday March 6, at the War Memorial.

The game seasawed back and forth at the start, and with two minutes left in the period, the count was knotted 6-6. Then the Cardinals gave an omen of future happenings as they worked their fast break with devastating effectiveness to reel off ten consecutive points. The first period ended with the Cardinals firmly in command 16-6.

The Kings put on a complete reversal of form in the second period. They beat the Cardinals at their own game, the fast break, knotting the score at 16-16. The lead seasawed back and forth, until Terry Murphy swished a jump shot from the outside at the buzzer to give his team, the Cardinals, a 25-23 halftime lead.

This second half was a complete antithesis of the first. The Kings, who had, except for a two minute stretch at the end of the first quarter, dominated

play, fell to pieces. The Cardinals, on the other hand, were demoralized. The score reflected this change. Mooney reeled off 18 consecutive points, and held the Kings scoreless for 7 minutes and 6 seconds until Bob Case sunk two free throws with 54 seconds left in the period. The third period ended with the Cardinals ahead 44-25.

By this time, it was too late for any rally as far as the Kings were concerned. Still thoroughly demoralized by the spurt of their opponents, they were never able to get back on the right track. The Cardinals substituted freely, and still managed to add to their impressive lead. The final tally was 56-35.

Standouts for the victors were Terry Murphy, whose deadly eye from the outside and whose outstanding generalship were key factors in the win, Kevin Dugan, who coordinated the fast breaks, and Otis Davis. Murphy led all scorers with 16 points. Bob Case led the Kings with 11 points, and Tom Rood and Walt Szarlacki each had 10.

Fisher Cagers Win 1, Lose 1

Splitting the final two games of the year last week, St. John Fisher College cagers have posted a winning 9-8 record for the season, the first in which the Cardinals faced all varsity competition.

The Fisher quintet closed on a winning note Saturday by defeating St. Michael's of Toronto in the Ontario city by a score of 84-75. In the final home game of the year March 3, the Cardinals lost to Rochester Institute of Technology by 77-72 count.

Against St. Mike's Coach Bobby Warner's charges led the Canadians by five points at the close of the first half, 44-39. They maintained the lead throughout the rest of the contest. Pacing the winners with 26 points, his lifetime best, was Brendan Carmody. Senior Jack Galbraith, playing his final game for St. John Fisher, added 19 points to close-out his all-time Fisher scoring record at 1129 points, a mark not likely to fall soon.

Senior co-captains John Galbraith and Mike Davis, both of whom were members of the starting five during their four years of collegiate court competition; were honored at halftime ceremonies during the final home basketball game of the season at St. John Fisher College.

Galbraith holds the all-time scoring record for the Cardinals with a career total of 1129 points. He led the team in scoring in each of his four years and also was the team's leading rebounder.

Davis, a graduate of Do Sales High School, Geneva, ranks second to Galbraith in total points scored and has made more scoring assists than any player in the college's court history.
