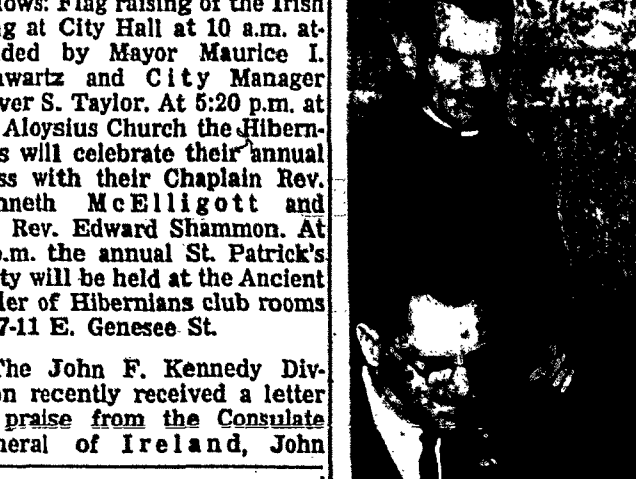
**Auburn Hibernians Look To March 17**
