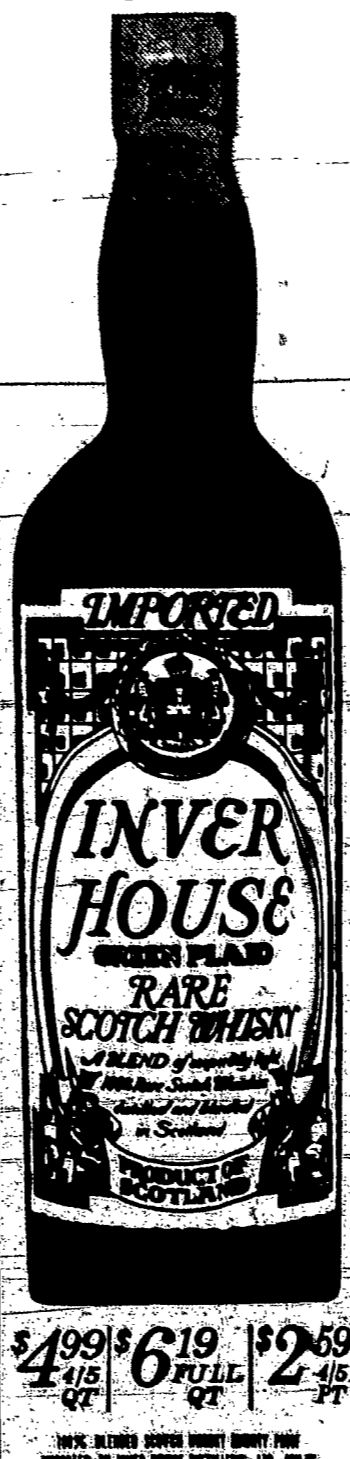

Rev. Charles J. Dolan, whose mother resides at 4477 Buffalo Rd., has just been appointed pastor of St. Louise de Marillac Church in Sumerest, Calif. Bishop Fury of the diocese of San Diego made the appointment effective March 12, 1965.

Fr. Dolan has been director of the library at the University of San Diego for the past eight years. Shortly after ordination he earned his degree in Library Science at the University of Southern California.

The new pastor attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries here in Rochester; he celebrated his first Solemn Mass at the Immaculate Conception parish in this city. His brother, Rev. Bernard Dolan, is an assistant pastor at St. Francis Xavier Church in Rochester.

Fr. Dolan has written several books, the latest two being "Civil Rights" and "John F. Kennedy, American"—a biography of the late President written for teenagers. He also has contributed many articles to theological and librarian periodicals.
