**History Club Tours State Capitol**

**VA Hospitals Closing Explained**

Hornell—An explanation of the government's proposal to close 21 Veterans' Administration hospitals throughout the United States was given the Monsignor Gannon Circle of the Columbian Squires recently by James McLaughlin of Hornell, New York State Veterans' counselor.

He shared the speakers' platform with the Rev. Gerald T. Connor, moderator of the local circle of the Squires, who spoke on religious vocations.

McLaughlin reviewed the reasons, chiefly economic—for the proposed closing of the VA hospitals, domiciliaries and regional offices. He discussed the public reaction which has resulted in a flood of letters and telegrams of protest to the curtailment of VA services.

Father Connor showed slides of daily life at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries in Rochester with a commentary on the steps towards the ordination of a young man to the Catholic priesthood.

The meeting was in charge of the spiritual committee of the Monsignor Gannon Circle. A new class of the Columbian Squires will begin its probationary period later this month. Any Catholic boy in grades 9 through 12 is eligible to join the organization. Father Connor pointed out.
