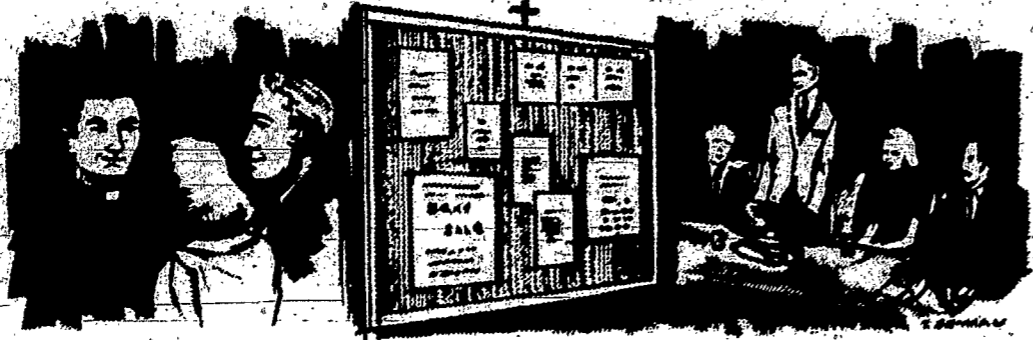

Ecumenism Gains Looking Sideways

San Francisco — (RNS) — A Catholic theologian declared here that Christians and Jews are experiencing an ecumenical spirit which will bear fruit in unity only if it deepens and if they are able to move it "into the arena of the worldly wisdoms."

Father Joseph P. Cahill, S.J., of Loyola University, Chicago, discussed the Catholic-Protestant-Jewish tradition at the Pacific Southwest Conference on Faith and Order, sponsored by the Councils of Churches of Arizona, California and Nevada and the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of San Francisco.

A number of priests and nuns were among the 200 theologians and Biblical experts who participated.

"Ecumenism has provided a climate in which members of one large religious tradition in which there are three main streams, instead of looking only straight ahead, and straight back, are now looking to either side," said Father Cahill.

Such side glances, he added, are bound to achieve "a purification of the imperfections, the human misunderstandings that creep into every religious tradition."

The task now, he said, "is to deepen our communion among ourselves, to do all we can under God to insure the continued existence of this community of religious truth, and to move the community of religious truth into the arena of the worldly wisdoms."

Father Cahill said the "passion and action of our day is the motion of the world to oneness, to unity, to community. To further this motion on any level is to have lived and to have been touched by Jesus

wish. That they all may be one."

"DISCUSSING current Catholic views of Scripture and tradition, the Jesuit priest said theological textbooks are far behind current thought among Catholic scholars.

"For many years," he said, "Catholic theologians taught that the later development (of dogma) is implicitly, either formally or virtually, contained in some more explicit statement found in Scripture.

"It is becoming more and more clear that this type of logical explanation — as if revelation were a simple series of propositions rather than a total event and mystery — for development of doctrine is simply inadequate."

Now, he went on, more Catholic theologians are viewing the Church "as a community with the characteristics of personal beings, of words being susceptible of increased understanding, of the presence of the Holy Spirit to protect and guide the new understanding."

The "Integrity and continuity of the saving message," he said, is not like "the links in a chain. We are rather concerned with a living process that at one and the same time is logical yet goes beyond the confines of logic and discursive reasoning."

Pope Praises Red Spacemen

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI joined in worldwide acclaim to the Soviet Air Force officer who became the first man to leave an orbiting spacecraft and float in space.

"Let us," he said, "add our words of praise to those of all the world to the hero of the adventure and his companion, to the scientists and experts who worked toward the success of this bold experiment."

In-citing the achievement of Lt. Col. Aleksei A. Leonov, who rode in the orbiting Voskhod II piloted by Col. Pavel I. Beljajev, the Pope voiced the hope "that this accomplishment might lead to the preservation of peace and progress."

Lay Teachers To Get Hike

St. Louis — (RNS) — The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of St. Louis has announced an increase in salaries of lay teachers in elementary and high schools effective in September.

Increases range from \$500 annually for new teachers and those on the first three steps of the salary schedule to \$50 for teachers with 12 years of experience. No increase was made

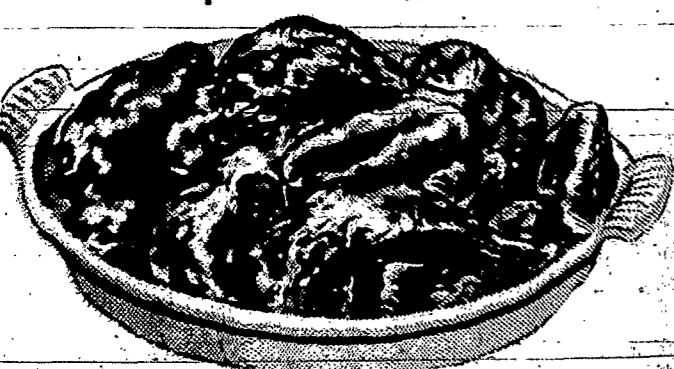
