Nazareth College Sets Summer Art Classes

A series of special programs designed to improve the quality of art education in area schools will be initiated at Nazareth College as part of this year's summer session.

The 1965 program will be directed primarily towards helping the regular classroom teacher from kindergarten to sixth grade to handle her own art program more effectively. In 1966, the program will include art history and be directed toward junior high teachers. The 1967 program will take advantage of the expanded facilities afforded by the new Arts Center and be designed primarily for senior high teachers.

Four to six undergraduate academic credits will be awarded upon completion of each program. Additional credits up to a total program of six credits may be earned by the execution of special projects.

College Offers English Institute During Summer

Nazareth College will again offer this summer an English Institute designed to aid high school English teachers.

Participants will be enrolled in two content courses, "Critical Approaches to Literature" and "History of the English Language," and in a coordinating seminar designed to deal with practical problems of teaching high school English. Special conferences in composition will constitute an extra-credit feature of the Institute.

St. Helen's Group Hears Lecture on Race

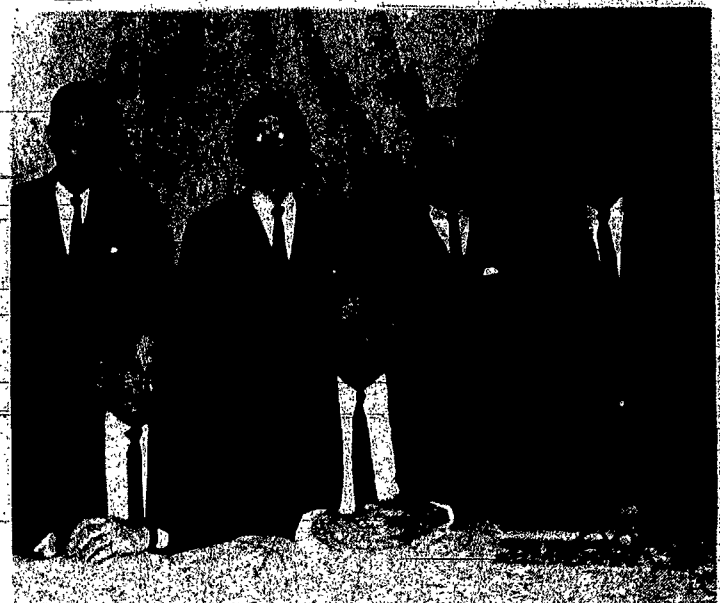
The greatest contribution an individual can make to better race relations is by acting in a friendly and tolerant way to members of other races, an expert in race relations told the Civics Club of St. Helen's school recently.

Treadwell Phillips, assistant Executive Director of the Monroe County Human Relations Commission, said that a basic problem is that few white people are aware of what the average Negro is like. Until recently, he pointed out, textbooks and television simply left Negroes out of the picture.

"The habit of 'stereotyping,' or generalizing about the behavior of a whole group from observing some of its members was also analyzed.

"The troublemakers are in the headlines, in any group, and we forget that the majority of the group are responsible, stable citizens," he explained.

A panel discussion concluded the meeting, with a range of questions ranging from Selma to Saul Alinsky.
