Elementary Level Updating Science Courses

A weekly in-service training program to help elementary school teachers of science keep up in their field is being carried on at St. Casimir's school in Elmira. 23 area teachers from Elmira, Horseheads, Corning and Bath, both nuns and lay teachers, are enrolled.

Sponsored by the state department of Education, the program is conducted by an instructor specially trained for the work. This center is under the direction of Sister Marie Stanislaus, S.S.J., who was certified as a Regional Instructor after completing an intensive course at Cornell University last summer.

The New York State Regional Science Program center at St. Casimir's is presenting a session of 30-weekly periods of at least two hours each.

Since the basic principles involved in teaching elementary school science can be demonstrated with simple equipment, the teachers attending these classes become adept at constructing such models and devices. (See adjoining photos)
