## **Eighth Century Christian Church**

Cairo-(RNS)-A Dutch archeological expedition has discovered these and other remains of an 8th Century Christian church a few-miles north of the famous temples of Abou-Simbel in the Egyptian Nubia. Top photo shows a fresco depicting Christ and four Apostles — Mark, John, Luke and Matthew. Below is a view of the nave of the church which was of mud brick and covered about 100 feet by 75 feet. The aperture (right) leads to the sanctuary and an altar. The door (left) is the entrance to a side room, believed to have been the sacristy. In front of the door are some stairs to the pulpit. Other freecoes included scenes of the Nativity, Crucifixion, and archangels.




