



Morton, Ill. —(RNS)— Eighth grade pupils at Blessed Sacrament School in Morton view a taped color TV lesson transmitted by 2,500 megacycle microwave from Bradley University in Peoria, 15 miles away. The telecast marked the first color educational TV transmission on a 2,500 MC microwave. Initial broadcasts also were seen in the university's student center by some 100 school superintendents, business executives and educational leaders. Bradley has been a leader in the development of regional educational TV using microwave transmission, which costs less than UHF broadcasts.



Eighth Century Christian Church

Calo —(RNS)—A Dutch archeological expedition has discovered these and other remains of an 8th Century Christian church a few miles north of the famous temples of Abou-Simbel in the Egyptian Nubia. Top photo shows a fresco depicting Christ and four Apostles — Mark, John, Luke and Matthew. Below is a view of the nave of the church which was of mud brick and covered about 100 feet by 75 feet. The aperture (right) leads to the sanctuary and an altar. The door (left) is the entrance to a side room, believed to have been the sacristy. In front of the door are some stairs to the pulpit. Other frescoes included scenes of the Nativity, Crucifixion, and archangels.

Hearing Aid for Confessional

Cincinnati — (RNS) — Father Dacian Batt, O.F.M., of St. Clement Friary in Cincinnati demonstrates the "Hear-All," a new hearing aid for the confessional box he developed with a fellow-priest, Father Maynard Tetreault of the same friary. First used in St. Clement church, the aid proved so popular with hard-of-hearing parishioners that construction was assigned to St. Joseph Brothers' School in Oldenburg, Ind. The "Hear-All" system includes two telephone instruments, power supply, wiring, light, two signs and numerous connectors. The sets sell for \$150 each and are guaranteed for three years.

Two Hats Needed In Business Life

Louisville — (RNS) — American businessmen are not only concerned with profit-making but also are "sincerely wrestling with the problem of values in business," a Roman Catholic theologian-sociologist told a national group of Protestant educators here.

In this quest, said Father Theodore C. Purcell, S.J., acting director of the Institute of Social Order at St. Louis University, most businessmen welcome the assistance of clergymen.

At the same time, the priest said in an address to a session of the National Council of Churches' Division of Christian Education annual meeting, the average clergyman has little understanding of the American economy and is not fully equipped to offer advice.

"To build the bridges that these businessmen want between moral theory and complex socio-economic decisions," he said, "requires imaginative research by people who wear the two hats of theology and social science. The theologians and social scientists need to work together."

"Value-free economics, or psychology, or business administration, or political science are myths," Father Purcell said as he stressed that economists must be reminded that business decisions cannot be dissociated from values.

"If prices are governed only by mere competitive factors of the marketplace, with no place for personal conscience," he said, "the public good will not necessarily be served."

"The competitive market is an important but imperfect mechanism. Sometimes it doesn't work at all. . . . Only research that builds bridges between economic science and

moral theology will be able to answer this question: "Is it price-fixing or is it price justice?"

Appearing at the same session of the annual meeting, a discussion on "Being a Person in a Community of Faith," Dean Alexander Schmemmann of St. Vladimir's Russian Orthodox Seminary at Tuckahoe, N.Y., stressed that the church should not be considered an institution or agency but a means toward finding "a new way of looking at the man-God-world relationship."

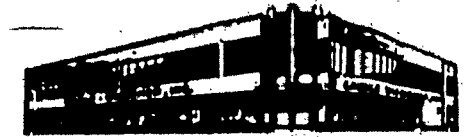
