Over 70 units are expected in the line of march. The parade will conclude with a huge fireworks display at 10 p.m. fired over Ontario Beach. More than 35,000 persons witnessed the program last year.

'Squinette' Unit To Be Formed In Hornell Area

Hornell — A new organization for Catholic girls of high school age in Hornell and the area will be formed next Sunday in St. Ann's School assembly hall.

The special meeting will begin at 8 p.m., with the Rev. Frederick F. Eisemann, assistant pastor, presiding. Father Eisemann will be moderator of the organization which will be sponsored by the Hornell Council, Ladies of Columbus.

The group will be known as the "Squinettes of Mary" and will be affiliated with units throughout the United States, Cuba, Canada, Mexico and the Philippines.

Activities will include cultural and social projects as well as those of a spiritual nature. Squinettes elect their own officers and each girl serves on a committee to carry out the program of the unit.

"Know-Love-Serve" is the motto of the organization. The Hornell unit will select the title for its circle following the organizational meeting Sunday.

Girls who signify an interest in belonging to the organization will be placed on probationary membership for a three-month period.

Liturgical Unit Includes Lalty

London — (RNS) — John Cardinal Heenan, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Westminster, has formed a 12-man archdiocesan liturgical commission to insure that the Constitution on the Liturgy is followed in every parish.

The commission is made up of four laymen, four secular priests and four religious priests. Msgr. Peter Angie was named chairman.

In addition to suggesting practical methods designed to further the liturgical movement, it will help individual parishes, and the whole diocese, to draw up a pastoral-liturgical program. Another task will be to keep abreast of new liturgical trends and ideas from abroad.

Father Gasnick, author, lecturer and member of the faculty of St. Bonaventure University is co-founder and national director of AIU, a grass roots project to help people of different races to know each other personally.

Minister Prefect Perry D. Finks, will conduct the business meeting which follows religious services.

Activities and plans on the agenda include the announcement of a testimonial dinner for James P. B. Duffy, a Franciscan Tertiary for 43 years.

Since 1905, after completing his education at Nazareth Hall, Rochester, Georgetown University and Harvard Law School, Mr. Duffy has held positions of great responsibility in public and civic office and through his 86 years has given himself to

all phases of community life.

Mr. Duffy is an honorary life member of the Rochester Teacher's Association; a trustee of St. Patrick's Church Society and an honorary life member of the Family Society of Rochester. He has received the pontifical decoration of the Knights of Malta and was decorated by the Catholic War Veterans. He is also a member of the Catholic Interracial Council of Rochester and an associate member of the Mother Cabrini Circle of Rochester.

The dinner will be held in St. Patrick's Church Hall at 5 p.m., Sunday May 23, following the regularly scheduled Third Order religious service and meeting.
