**Noted Critic
Set At College**
A noted critic, author and educator will deliver two public lectures at Nazareth College Thursday, April 29 at 3:30 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Stanley Edgar Hyman, staff writer for THE NEW YORKER, will discuss "The Armed Vision: Modern Literary Method" in the afternoon and "The Critic's Credentials" in the evening.
Hyman is also book critic for THE NEW LEADER and Professor of English at Bennington College, Vermont. Among his publications are "The Armed Vision," a study in the methods of modern literary criticism; "Poetry and Criticism," for revolutions in literary taste; and "The Tangled Bank," an analysis of Darwin, Marx, Freud and Freud as Imaginative Writers. He is also editor of "The Critical Performance," an anthology of American and British Literary criticism-of our century.

Accompanying Hyman will be his wife, well-known American author Shirley Jackson, whose macabre short story "The Lottery" has become a modern American classic. Mrs. Hyman is also the author of "The Road Through the Wall," "The Haunting of Hill House," and "We Have Always Lived in the Castle." Her short stories have appeared in prize collections and other anthologies and been frequently presented on radio and television.

**Sister Beatrice
Receives Grant**
Sister Mary Beatrice Curran, teacher and chairman of Social Studies Department at Our Lady of Mercy High School, is one of 45 teachers to receive a grant from the National Science Foundation for a six weeks summer institute in Anthropology at the University of Arizona at Tucson, Arizona.

Sister Mary Beatrice obtained her AB degree at Duquesne University and her MA at the Catholic University of America.

The Institute, for junior high and high school teachers of natural and social sciences, will include lectures by outstanding anthropologists, visits to local museums, and a week's field trip to Northern Arizona for site excavation, tours of museums and ruins, and of Hopi and Navajo Reservations.
The purpose of the Institute, as stated by John H. Chilcott, Institute Director, is to introduce anthropological content, theory, and techniques into the secondary school, both in terms of enriching the curriculum and in creating better understanding of student behaviour in and out of the classroom.
The Institute in Anthropology is the only one of its kind being supported by the National Science Foundation this summer.
