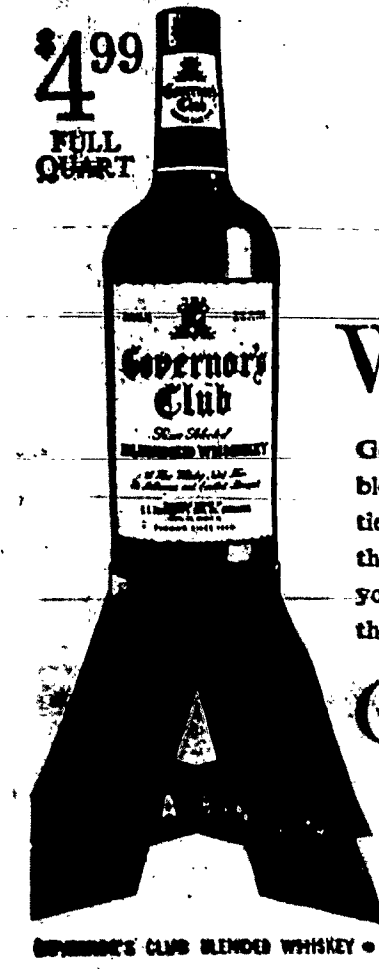


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Mrs. Helen Smith Named Program Director at CYO

Mrs. Smith has been a member of the C.Y.O. Teaching Staff for the past fourteen years. Prior to her employment at C.Y.O., Mrs. Smith was an Aquatic Director and Gymnasium Instructor at the Rochester Turners.

While at C.Y.O. Mrs. Smith has accomplished many firsts in initiation of C.Y.O. programs. Among her successful accomplishments have been the expanding of C.Y.O. Day Camps from two to the present five; initiation of neighborhood swim classes using privately owned home pools.

This particular program has blossomed from instruction in three pools to the present fifteen pools. Her initiation and supervision of Parochial and Invitational Cheerleading Tournaments have won statewide acclaim for C.Y.O.

Physical education classes for student nurses from local hospitals was another first among Mrs. Smith's long line of achievements.

Mrs. Smith in her new duties will be principally concerned with the general supervision of all C.Y.O. programs as well as continuation of her affiliation with the aforementioned special programs.

Knights Set New Record

McQuaid Jesuit High's track record was a tidy 1-1-1 as the Knights moved into the heart of their dual meet schedule this week.

Not included in that record was a mile relay bid at last Saturday's Penn Relays in Philadelphia, where McQuaid ran the fastest time yet by a Monroe County school for the mile event. The Knights' foursome of Steve Fahy, John Stanley, Chuck Maier, and Eric Kendrick covered the distance in 3:31.6, 5 seconds below the school record set in 1959 and also under the records on the books at the Brighton, Geneva, Utica and Elmira relays. Still, in the stiff competition at Penn, that time was good for only a third place.

In dual meet competition last week, McQuaid had to settle for a 45-45½ tie at Canisius when the home forces rallied to score 22 of the meet's last 23 points. In previous meets, McQuaid had lost to Webster, 65-48, and defeated Penn Yan, 83-30.

Fahy continued his heavy contribution of points with wins in both dashes, and Chuck Maier and Dick Lenhard scored their third wins without loss by taking the 440 and mile.

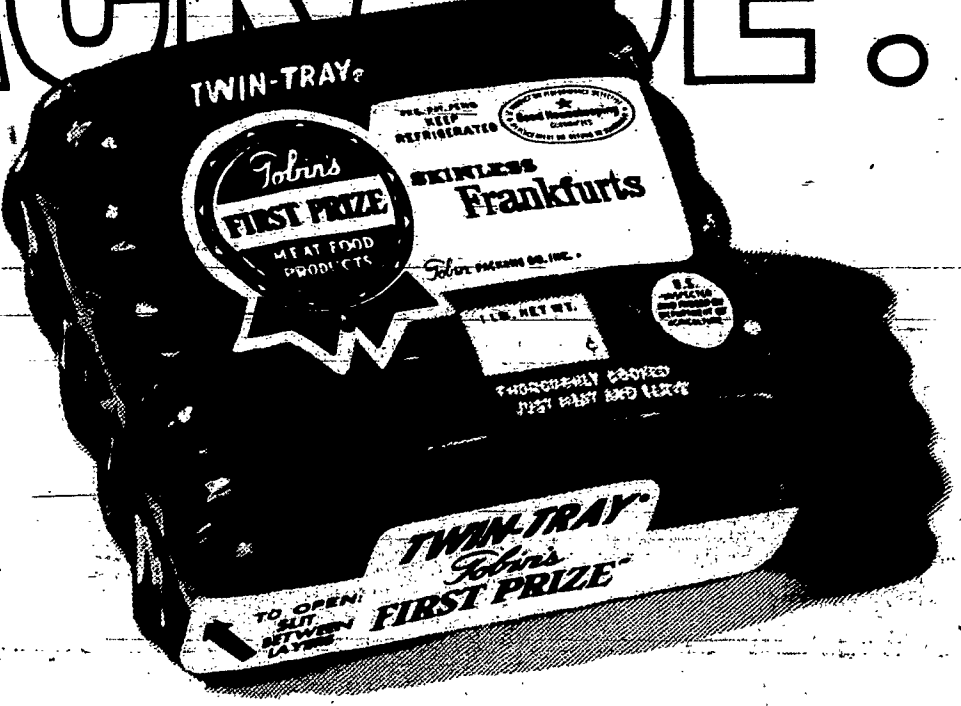
