Father Manley -

A Scholarly Pastor Who Preached in Simple Terms

Elmira - The late Father Thomas Manley was a priest with a scholarly mind, but capable of presenting the sublime doctrines of the Faith in a simple manner, said the preacher at Father Manley's solemn funeral Mass. The Rev. Joseph F. Hogan gave the eulogy for the pastor of St. Mary's, Elmira, last Saturday, April 24, 1965.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was offered at St. Mary's Church by Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey for Father Manley, who died on April 20, 1965, at the age of 54. He had been pastor of St. Mary's since 1959.

"His sermons reflected his great knowledge of scripture and theology," Father Hogan's eulogy noted, "and most of all, whatever he said came from a sincere heart."

The funeral sermon paid tribute also to the genial and kindly Elmira pastor, as "a priest's priest."

"To come to his rectory was always like coming home. There was always the glad handshake, the cheerful smile and the kind word. He was greatly admired by his fellow priests," Father Hogan, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul's, stressed.

While urging his hearers to pray for the repose of Father Manley's soul, "for like all us priests, he carried divine prerogatives of the priesthood in a vessel of clay," Father Hogan said that Father Manley was well prepared for death.

He quoted a letter written by Father Manley, on the day he died, to be opened only after his death:

"God has been good to me during life; please do not mourn my passing. It will be the passage from the pilgrimage of life on earth to the eternal enjoyment of the Beatific Vision in heaven, our lasting city."

In addition to the priests who served as ministers of the Mass, five Monsignori and 58 other priests were present for the funeral, in a church filled with Father Manley's friends and parishioners.
