Former Teacher, Principal  
Solemn Requiem Mass for Sister M. Leonida was held in the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse on Wednesday, April 28. Sister died at St. Joseph Convent Infirmary on April 26, 1965.

The Rev. Donald Ophals of Watervliet, N. Y., a nephew, was celebrant of the Mass. The Rev. James Slattery was deacon and the Rev. Daniel Brent, sub-deacon. Master of ceremonies was the Rev. Albert Schnacky.
