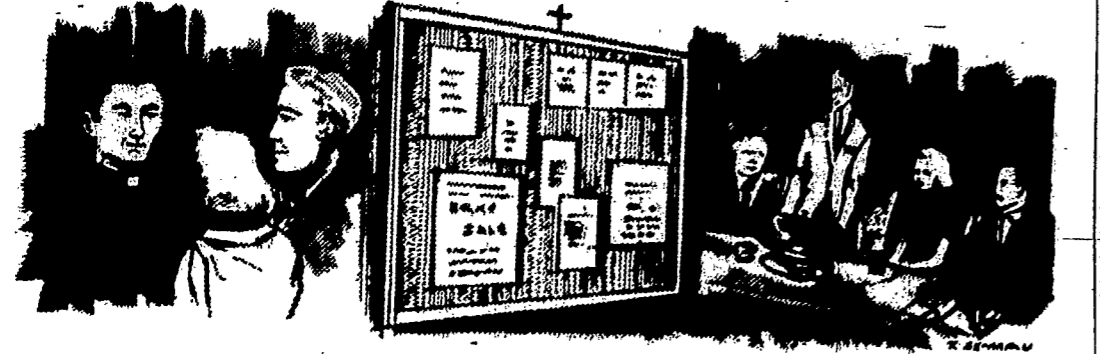

### Geneva Panelists Discuss Adjusting To High School

Geneva—It's a big step from grammar school to high school. It brings with it emotional problems and calls for many adjustments. This fact was underscored recently by speakers at the panel discussion on "How To Prepare Your Grammar School Child for High School" sponsored by Mother's Club of St. Stephen's School.

One hundred and thirty-five parents and teachers attended the program held in the school hall which featured three panelists: Dr. William Chiverton, superintendent of Geneva Public Schools; Dr. Gerald Smith, professor of English at Geneseo State University; and the Rev. Edward Golden, of Rochester, former assistant at St. Stephen's Church.

Dr. William Hosking of Hobart and William Smith Colleges served as moderators for the panel discussion. Dwelling on the intellectual preparation of the grammar school child for high school, Dr. Chiverton emphasized that the parents should set the stage for learning at home by providing a time and place for home work and by good example and by having books and reading material and using them themselves.

PARENTS AND SCHOOLS are partners in the education of children, he said. The parents should be deeply interested in the child and in what is going on in school but there is a fine line here between being interfering and interfering in school policies.

Parents should support the schools in every way. One way is to see that the child behaves well in school. Children should be taught to behave in the home and then they will behave in school.

On the subject of home work, he advised using the school's method even if it is not the method the parent was taught. Otherwise the child will be confused. He stressed that time should be set for homework. A child also needs time for thinking, writing, and going over notes.

### POPE PAUL'S QUESTION

THE HOLY FATHER'S MISSION AID TO THE ORIENTAL CHURCH

The Holy Father asked Monsignor Joseph T. Ryan, President of the Pontifical Mission for Palestine, this question in the Holy Land last year. The refugees for whom he expressed his concern are the 1.2 million victims of a cruel war fought in the Near East seventeen years ago. Young and old, they are huddled together in camps in Jordan, Syria, Lebanon and Gaza. They are hungry. They need clothing, medicine, education and the sacraments. Many are blind, deaf, crippled, suffering from cancer, tuberculosis and other dread diseases. Thousands have known no home but the camp's hovels. The Palestine refugees today are as much the concern of Pope Paul VI as they were in 1949, when he helped establish the Pontifical Mission for Palestine. This Mission provides goods, services, and money to feed, shelter, clothe and educate refugees toward self-sufficiency. "Is there anything you will do to help these refugees?" the Pope asks you!
