Red Hat No Honor

Cairo — (NC) — An Eastern rite prelate who strongly opposed the appointment of Eastern rite patriarchs to the college of cardinals at the February 22 consistory has issued a statement here setting forth his objections.

He is Archbishop Elias Zoghby, vicar for Egypt of Melkite rite Patriarch Makarios IV Saigh, one of the patriarchs who were made cardinals. At first the archbishop announced he would resign from his post in protest against the entry of his patriarch into the college. Later he agreed to discuss the matter with Cardinal Saigh.

Archbishop Zoghby stressed in his statement that the patriarchate is a traditional and universal institution in the Church which has been recognized by the ecumenical councils while the rank of cardinal is only "local and Roman." Therefore, he said, a patriarch cannot be "promoted" to the rank of cardinal.
