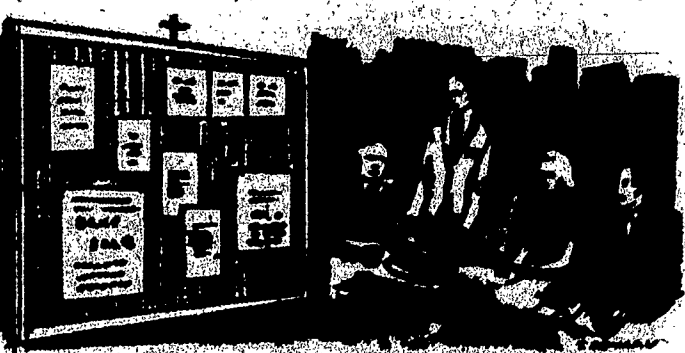

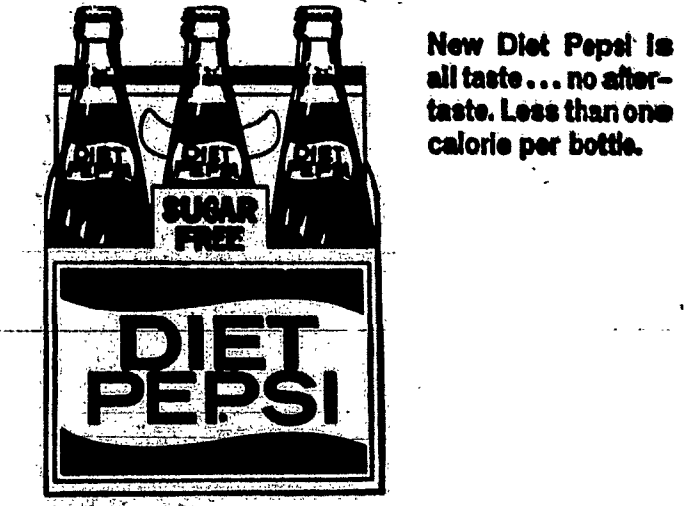

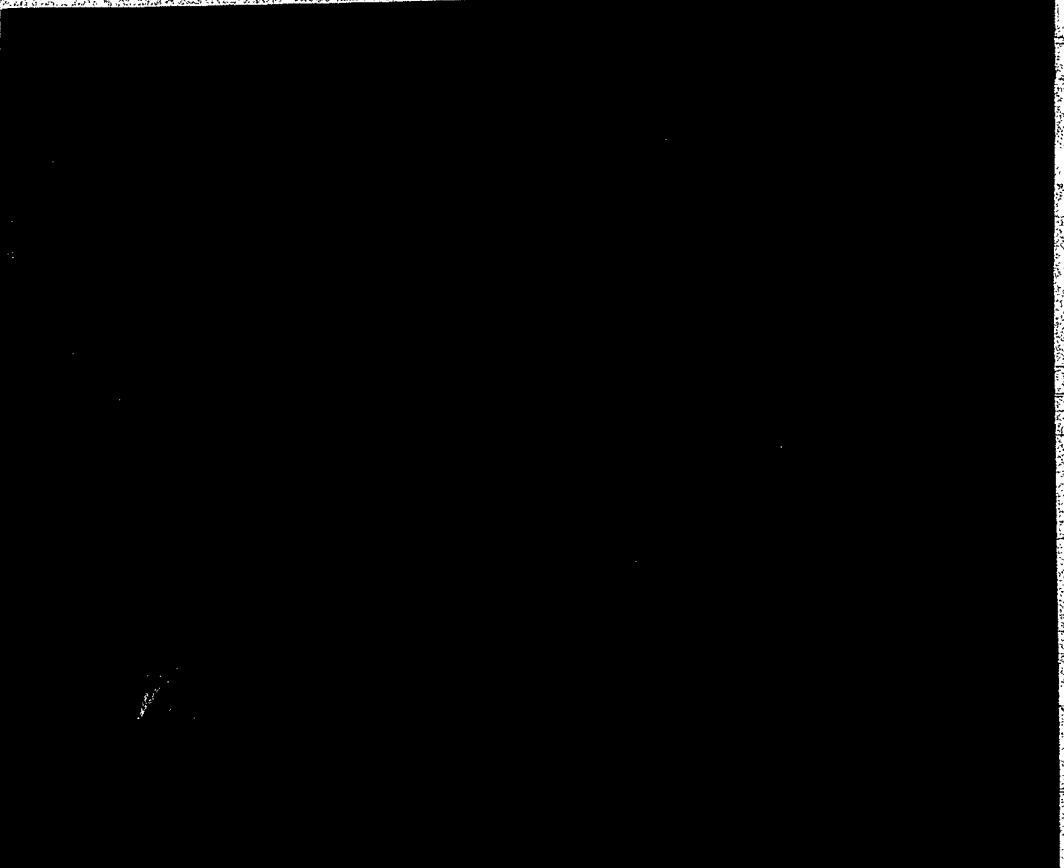
Fisher Grads Sponsor Talk On Education
