

Scouting Award for Cesarone

Veteran Scouter Joseph G. Cesarone was selected by Otsego Council Viking District for the Distinguished Service Award at the annual dinner held at East-ridge High School.

The award was created to recognize outstanding men in the scouting program for their tenure, quality of service, versatility of service in positions assigned, training and participation in community activities.

Registered since 1940, Cesarone was active in many capacities at St. Andrew's Church. He was an assistant and scoutmaster for 18 years. He was assigned to the Commissioners Staff for four years and is presently chairman of the Catholic Committee on Scouting for the Rochester area.

Contributing generously and willingly to parish projects and activities, his leadership has inspired youth from the Little League to the Young Adults Club.

In 1964, Cesarone was the recipient of the St. George Award, presented by Bishop

James E. Kearney for his promotion of the Ad Altare Dei Award and the annual Scout Retreat movement at St. Michael's Mission.

In Buffalo

Jesuits Will Ordain Two From Diocese

Two young men from the Diocese of Rochester will be among six members of the Society of Jesus ordained to the priesthood on Thursday, June 6, in the Canisius College Chapel, Buffalo, N.Y.

The Most Rev. James A. McNulty, Bishop of Buffalo, will be the ordaining prelate.

The two men are Rev. John Donahue, S.J., of St. Stephen's parish in Geneva and Rev. Orestes P. Coccia, S.J., of St. Francis of Assisi parish, Rochester.

Father Donahue, the son of Mr. Edward F. Donahue and the late Mrs. Donahue, of 391 Castle St., Geneva, is a graduate of St. Stephen's school and St. Francis de Sales high school in that city. He entered the Jesuit Order after one year at LeMoyne College in Syracuse.

In his 14 years of training, Father Donahue has received his B.A. and M.A. degrees from Fordham University, and has taught English and Latin at McQuaid High School in Rochester. He did his Theology studies at Woodstock College in Maryland.

He will celebrate his first solemn Mass at St. Stephen's Church on Sunday, June 15, at 10 a.m. The Rev. John Chittrey Murray, S.J., of the Woodstock Theology faculty will preach. Deacon of the Mass will be Monsignor Joseph DeVaney of Ft. Meyers, Florida. A reception will be held at St. Stephen's school hall in the afternoon from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

Mr. Frank Coccia, and the late Mrs. Coccia, of 277 Saxton St. in Rochester, studied at SS. Peter and Paul's school and Aquinas Institute. He also completed one year at LeMoyne College before joining the Jesuits.

Completing his Philosophy studies at Shrub Oak, N.Y., he taught Latin, Greek and French for 3 years at Canisius High School in Buffalo, and for one year at McQuaid High in Rochester. Since 1962, he has been studying Theology at Regis College, Toronto, Canada.

Father Coccia will celebrate his first solemn Mass at SS. Peter and Paul's Church, Main St. W., on Sunday, June 13 at 11 a.m. The Archbishop for the Mass will be the Rev. Joseph S. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Rochester. The preacher will be the Rev. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Horseheads, N.Y. The deacon will be Very Rev. Msgr. George A. Cucuzzi, Chancellor of the Diocese of Rochester. Subdeacon will be the Rev. Nicholas Arioli, C.S.P., superior of Precister Blood Seminary, Rochester. The Master of Ceremonies will be the Very Rev. Bruno Cucuzzi O.C.D., of St. Joseph Seminary, Peterborough, N.H.

A reception will be held at the St. Francis of Assisi parish hall, from 4 to 7 p.m. that afternoon.

A third member of the ordination group will be the Rev. Joseph T. Angiella, S.J., of Hollywood, California. His late mother, Mrs. Josephine Farina Angiella, was a former Rochesterian.
