Classes Undergo Revision at N.D.

A major revision of the class schedule at Notre Dame High School is planned for the school year 1965-66, it was announced by Sister M. Declan, principal in the latest issue of the principal's bulletin to parents.

The new schedule will provide seven 52-minute periods with study time for each subject under the supervision of the class teacher instead of the conventional study hall, once a day. At the present time, the average student takes six subjects and has one 41 minute study period.

The longer class period will also benefit slower students who need more assistance. Better students will find time for greater study and discussion in depth, an opportunity to view documentary films that were too long for the 41-minute period, and more time to ask questions, Sister Declan said.

The activity period will be retained in shortened form and will come in the middle of the day, either before or after lunch.

Advantages to be obtained with the new schedule include: interesting variations of classroom routine, for example, an English or history teacher who wishes to give a special written theme may teach four periods in a given week and supervise

the written theme on the fifth day; guest speakers in a class will have a longer time for their presentations and for answering questions; and the weekly quota of physical education time will be increased.

With regular five-day-a-week classes increased from 205 minutes to a total of 280 minutes, Notre Dame teachers are anticipating "happier homework" sessions and improved school day performances.
