Annual German Day celebration under the auspices of the Federation of German-American Societies, traditionally held on the second Sunday of August, this year been advanced to today, June 27, at the Monroe County Fairgrounds in East Henrietta Road at 2:30 p.m.

Part of the Fairgrounds will be transformed into a Beer Garden of old world atmosphere. Visitors will be entertained by the Monroe County Park Band under conductor John Cummings, by Henry Heister's Orchestra and by the Royal Bavarian Band under the baton of Arnold Tausch.

A male chorus, composed of members of the Teutonic Liedertafel, the Badischer Mannerchor and the Rochester Youth Saengerchor, will render two songs under the leadership of Arnold Tausch. The Folkdancers of the Bavarian Society "Alpenrosen" will give an exhibition of their skill under Gary Mueller. Disc Notes

After two decades as England's top theater, radio, TV and recording star, Harry Secombe has finally made his American debut in a new stage hit, Pickwick. And a new release by Philips is aptly titled, Introducing the Phenomenal Voice of Harry Secombe.

Pickwick opened in San Francisco last month and will move to Broadway in the fall. It is destined to become as big a success here as it was in England, in large part due to Harry Secombe. He has been to England and parts of Europe what Ennio Pinza was to the United States.

His powerful, impressive voice has a remarkable range. Often you will see a close resemblance to the late Mario Lanza. In every song he offers class, imagination and great sound.

The album includes one of the great songs of the year from Pickwick, If I Ruled the World plus a showcase of sound from other great hits. There is The Drinking Song from Student Prince, Climb Ev'ry Mountain from Sound of Music, Make Believe from Show Boat plus Stranger in Paradise, Hello Young Lovers, This Nearly Was Mine, Falling in Love With Love, If I Loved You, Song of the Vagabonds, Younger Than Springtime, and You'll Never Walk Alone.

Philips uses superlatives again as the title of the LP, The Spectacular Shirley Baezy, and again they're right. Long a top singing star in England and here, she enhanced her career with the fascinating title song performance of Goldfinger.

On this album she lends her unique talent to a fascinating

performance of such tunes as As I Love You, My Funny Valentine, How About You, Hands Across the Sea, The Wayward Wind and Kiss Me, Honey Honey, Kiss Me.

Superb artistry and warmth are always evident when you listen to More Morgana King on the Mercury Wing label. Her sweet, dreamy voice adds a special touch to such great tunes as Why Was I Born, Can't Help Lovin' Dat Man, There's a Lull in My Life, The Song Is You, Mad About the Boy, Mean to Me, Down in the Depths, Bill, Here I'll Stay, and For You, For Me, Forevermore.

The Riviera Orchestra offers three fine instrumental albums on the Mercury Wing label with vibrant piano and strings, fine sax and all around excellence.
