Town Stalls on Church for Negroes

Canton, Miss. —(RNS)—To plan the church's design, no permit has been taken on a plan to erect a church building. The plan was approved in a referendum by councilmen in May, 1963.

Attendance en bloc of Father Luke and members of his Negro congregation was approved in advance by Bishop Gerow. In a letter to Sacred Heart parish, read at all Masses, the prelate said he was "very much disturbed at the refusal of the city to grant a permit for . . . a church in which our Colored Catholics can attend Mass."

Father Luke Mikesch of Holy Child Jesus mission said his action, endorsed by Bishop Richard O. Gerow, was not directed against the Sacred Heart parish, but against Canton officials who "delay, delay, delay" action on his bid for a building permit.

"I just don't know what we are going to do," he said. "The only reason we did this on Sunday was just to show that we really don't have a church. It is not that we want to go to this church (Sacred Heart); we really want our own."

The priest, a member of the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity, said "despite many concessions made to the white community of Canton in planning the church's design, no permit has been taken on a plan to erect a church building."

He pointed out to newsmen that Mayor L. S. Matthews of Canton in May, 1963, sent him a letter which promised a building permit to erect a church. (The mission consists of a convent, rectory and a school for Negro children; Mass is held in the school gym.)

Canton's deputy mayor, Alderman Hermit Jones, said that the aldermen must pass on building permits and that the mayor could not speak for them unless a tie vote developed.

Alderman Jones told reporters: "I think this man Luke is just a trouble-maker. I am speaking only for myself, but I don't know if it (the permit) will ever be accepted because of the things he has done."

Among the concessions the priest made in negotiations leading to the application for a permit were these:

1. Installation of a board fence to "shield" the proposed church structure from a white neighborhood.
