Lutherans Said 'Hopeful'

Dayton—(NC)—Two Lutheran Church in America leaders said here there are hopeful signs for growth of mutual respect and understanding between Lutherans and Catholics.

Interviewed at the LCA's Ohio Synod convention here, Dr. O. V. Anderson, Milwaukee, of the church's executive council, and Dr. Herbert W. Veler, Columbus, synod president, agreed there are new opportunities for Lutheran-Catholic cooperation.

Dr. Anderson said the field of Biblical scholarship, the area of social concern and the liturgical movement provide "common ground" for fruitful interfaith cooperation.

Dr. Veler said the current examination of basic doctrines of the two churches by a select group of Lutherans and Catholic theologians is not premature.
