## New Parish in West Webster, New Duties for 63 Priests

Sixty-three priests of the Rochester Diocese will begin new assignments next Tuesday according to clergy appointments made by Bishop Kearney this week.

The Bishop also established a new parish in West Webster. It will be called Holy Spirit parish.

The clergy assignments, as announced by the Chancery today, include:

- Three veteran pastors have resigned from active pastoral duties and each has been named a pastor-emeritus.
- Seven priests were named pastors.
- Twelve priests were assigned special duties.
- Thirty-one assistant pastors were transferred to other parishes.
- Ten newly ordained priests were given their first parish appointments.

All appointments are effective Tuesday, June 29, at 6 p.m.

### PASTORS-EMERITUS

Rev. William Cannan is named pastor-emeritus of St. Patrick's Church, Corning. He is a patient at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira.

Rev. Bernard Hanna is named pastor-emeritus of St. James Church, Trumansburg. He will reside at the rectory of St. Peter and Paul Church, Elmira.

Rev. G. Stuart Hogan is named pastor-emeritus of St. Gregory Church, Marion.

Rev. Charles Connell, from chaplain at Nazareth Academy, Rochester, to pastor of St. Gregory Church, Marion.

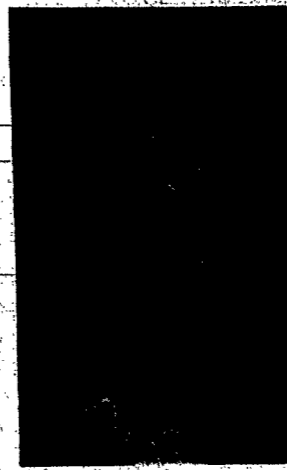
Rev. Lawrence Murphy, from assistant pastor at Sacred Heart Cathedral, to spiritual director at St. Andrew's Seminary.

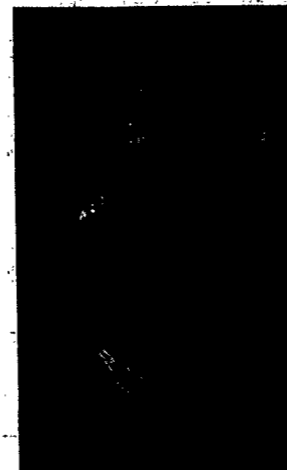

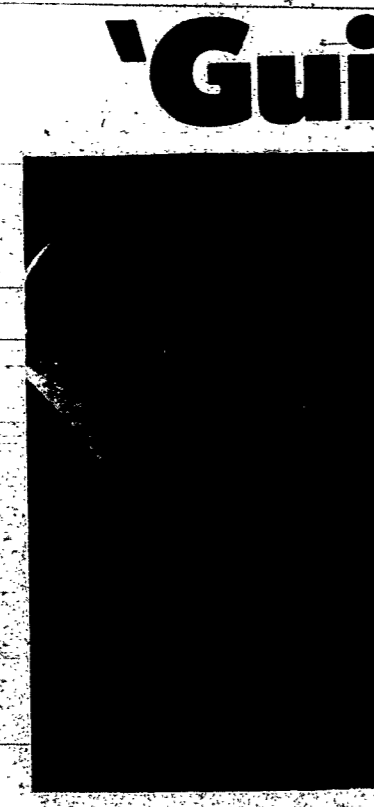

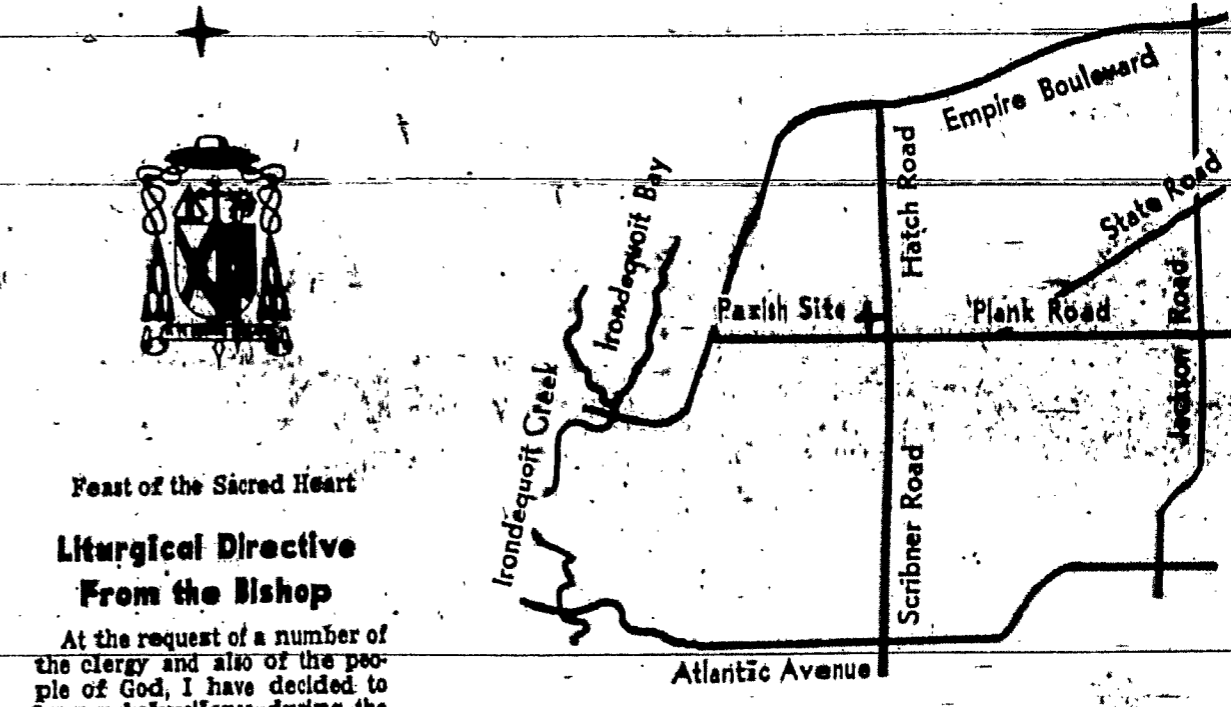

## Holy Spirit Parish In West Webster

Catholics in rapidly growing West Webster have a new parish—and a new pastor.

Father Joseph Lynch will give up a twenty year career with test tubes as science professor at St. Andrew's Seminary to organize the new Holy Spirit parish.

Site of the parish is a 10 acre parcel of land at the corner of Hatch and Plank Roads.

Boundaries of the new parish run along the middle of Empire Boulevard beginning at Irondequoit Bay to Jackson Road,

South to Atlantic Avenue, then west to Irondequoit Creek and back up to the Bay.

Father Lynch is currently looking for a place to hold Sunday Mass within that area. He will reside at St. Joseph's rectory, Fenfield, until he can locate a house in the Holy Spirit parish confines.

## 'Guidelines' for Ecumenism

U.S. Catholics will soon be authorized to cross the chasm of denominational differences to attend Protestant church services.

A wide-ranging list of guidelines issued by the U.S. bishops' Commission for Ecumenical Affairs sweeps away several restrictions which have long kept Catholics from rites in other churches.

One particularly sore spot is erased — Catholics may now be attendants at Protestant wedding ceremonies.

Lines are still drawn, however, against receiving Communion in other churches or pulpit exchanges by priests and ministers.

Strongly recommended is observance of the January Christian Unity Week. The Commission said it hoped the devotion will be "extended and intensified in our churches."

The guidelines were announced in Washington today. The NCWC News Service reported the statement as follows:

The commission's guidelines cover joint prayer and joint worship ("communio in sacris") by Catholics and other Christians. In line with the Second Vatican Council's ecumenism decrees, it recommends both but with certain reservations, particularly in the case of joint worship.

### Becket Hall For Seminarians At College

Becket Hall will be the name of the new diocesan House of Studies at St. John Fisher College.

It will be "home" for the seminarians making their college studies at the East Avenue school.

A pioneer band of 30 students from St. Andrew's Seminary will inaugurate the project this September. Residence arrangements for this year are now under study pending construction of a \$175,000 building on the college campus next year.

Becket Hall is named for St. Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury, who was martyred in the year 1170.
