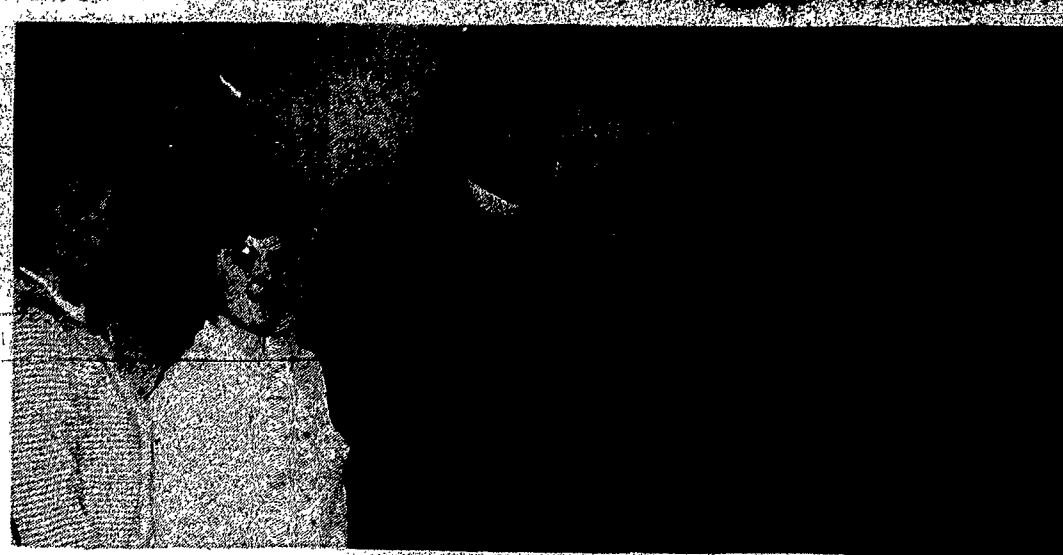

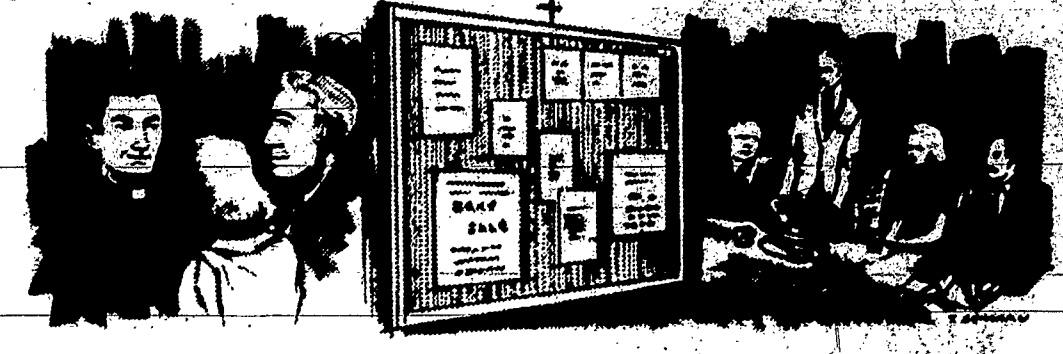
Notre Dame:

St. James Mercy Graduates 16

Hornell—Graduation is a ceremony of thanksgiving, Bishop Kearney told 16 graduates of St. James Mercy Hospital School of Nursing and School of X-Ray Technology Sunday, June 20.

The Bishop, in his address following the presentation of diplomas, in St. James Mercy Church, emphasized the appropriateness of holding nursing school commencement exercises in a church.

"It is most fitting that this type of graduation, which is really a ceremony of gratitude, take place in the presence of the greatest Physician, Our Lord Jesus Christ," Bishop Kearney told the large assembly of Sisters of Mercy, relatives and friends of the graduates.

"All through their training, these graduates have called on Our Lord for His help in the inevitable difficulties. Receiving this diploma is, in a sense, an answer to their prayers."

Bishop Kearney celebrated Mass following the awarding of diplomas and the imparting of the Pontifical Blessing. The Rev. John L. Coonan, chaplain of St. James Mercy Hospital, presented the graduates to the Bishop, and read the Epistle and Gospel of the Mass.
