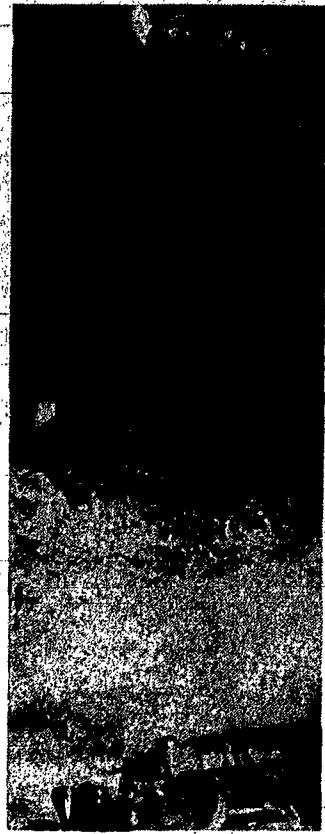
## Two Principals Honored

Representatives of De Sales classes of '60, '61, '62, '63 and '64 assisted as hosts and hostesses. Mrs. Robert Morrison was general chairman.

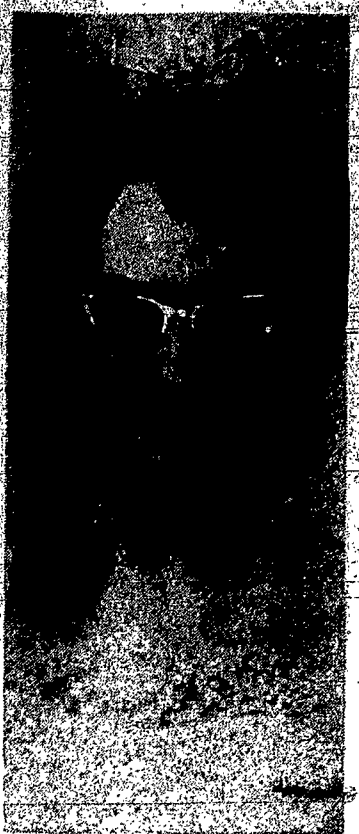
