Television Dialogue

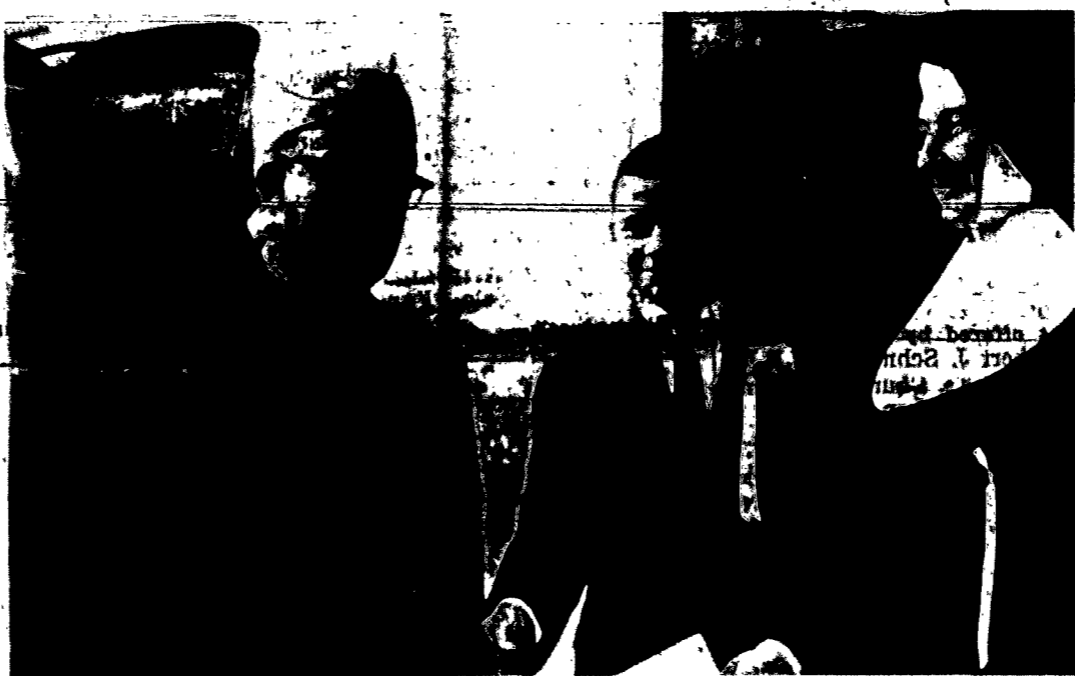

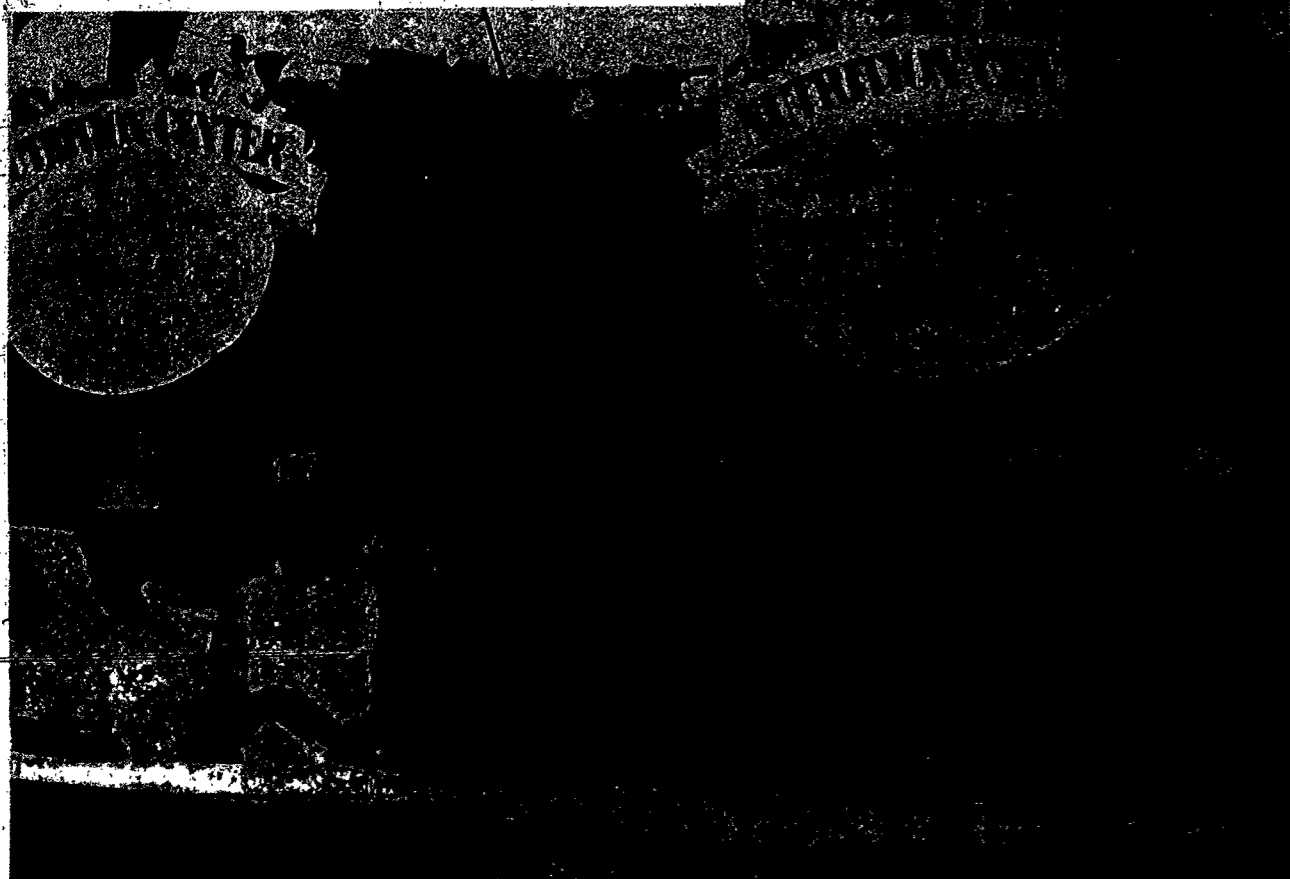


Pilgrims to see Madonna

The "Ben Casey" uniform at left, worn by Brother Gregory, consists of white jacket, trousers and black shoes—the only religious identification is on the name tag. Brother Paul, at right, wears the habit traditionally worn in hospital work, including sandals and large rosary hanging from his belt. During off-hours, the Franciscans wear the traditional brown robes and sandals.
