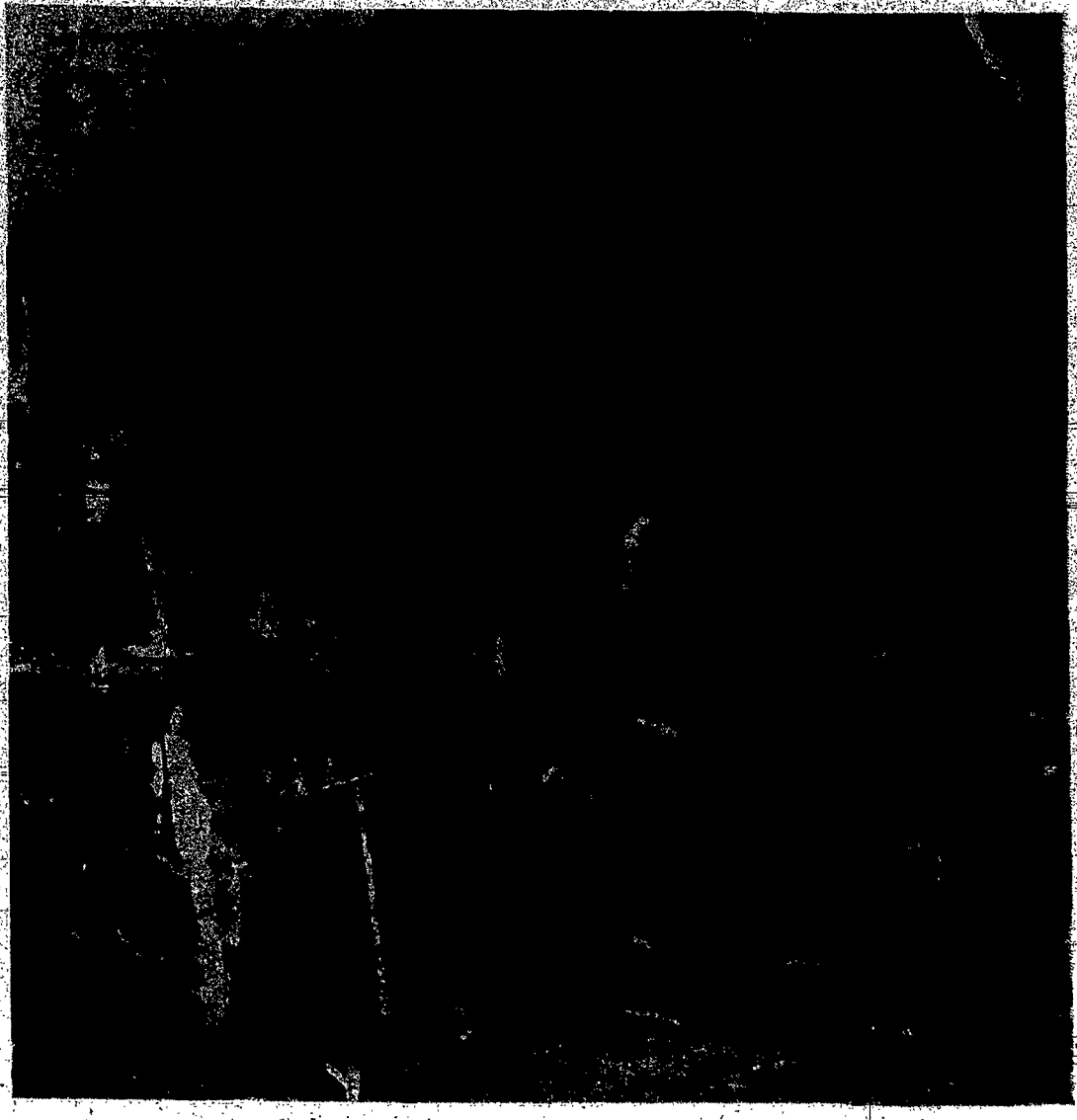

Brother Offers Mass For Vincent Bernardo

Solemn Funeral Mass for Vincent Bernardo was offered in St. Anthony Church, Saturday, July 3. Mr. Bernardo died June 29, 1965 at Highland Hospital after a brief illness.

Late Pastor's Death Said "Finest Sermon"

"It is given to some priests to preach their finest sermon in the final moments of their lives. This was the great grace that was given to Father Crimmens," emphasized the preacher at the funeral of Rev. Alphonsus P. Crimmens. The funeral Mass was offered by Bishop Kearney at the church of the late pastor, St. Mary's in Canandaigua, on Wednesday, June 30, 1965.

Father Crimmens died suddenly on Saturday afternoon, June 26, 1965, stricken as he was entering his confessional.

After reviewing Father Crimmens' 31-year career in the priesthood, Father Raymond P. Nolan continued:

"We will remember our friend most of all for his attitude toward his illness during recent months and the fact that he faced death as unflinchingly as he had ever faced anything."

Mentioning that in recent weeks, the veteran pastor took his regular turn in the pulpit, conducting devotions, etc. Father Nolan said:

"In a very true sense, he died as he wanted to live—doing the work of the priesthood."

In moving terms, the preacher described the last moments of the 56-year-old priest's life:

"The final grace that was given to Father Crimmens was that he died in the presence of his two assistant pastors and with the wonderful consolation of the Sacraments which he himself had administered to so many others."

Father Nolan, pastor of St. Stephen's Church in nearby Geneva, used the solemn occasion to remind the church-filled with priests, nuns, relatives and parishioners of Father Crimmens, that death was a fitting subject for meditation:

"Each one of us should meditate on death frequently—not on someone else's death, but on our own. We should pray frequently for the grace of a happy death, because this and this alone is the one thing that is necessary for a successful life."
