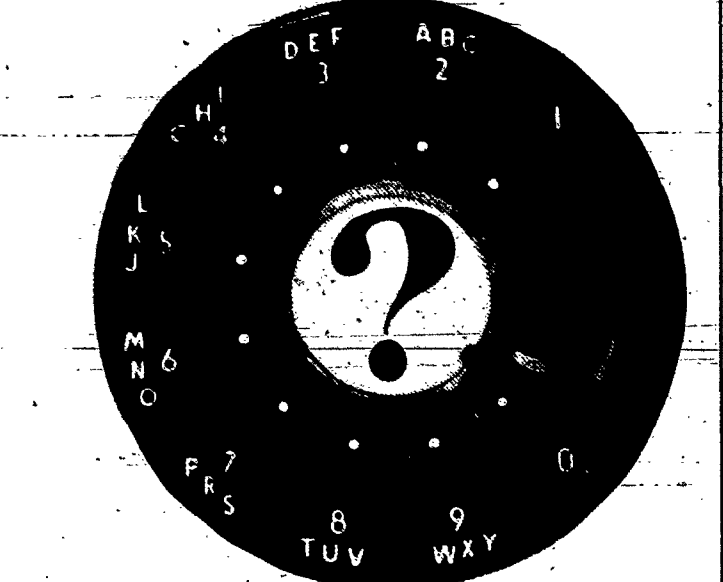

Anne Klein Suede & Leather

Anne Klein had made a great name for herself in the field of designing sophisticated fashions for the junior-sized. Twice a year, every year, we'd preview her collections and tape interviews with this dynamic young designer. The last time was in July 1964. Then for a

whole year, we heard or saw nothing of her—until earlier this month when we were in New York previewing the Fall and Winter Collections in the American Designer series of Eleanor Lambert.

Exactly one year later, we popped Anne Klein and with a turn of her deft hand from fabrics—as such—to suede, buckskin and glove leather making them into superfabrics with an entity and fashion purpose of their own. Admitting with a relaxed breeziness we'd not sensed in Mrs. Klein before, she exclaimed "I took time out for living really has made a gayer, livelier, happier appearing young lady who's truly alive as never before."

Perhaps part of the transformation of Anne Klein from a tense sophisticate to a lively, lovely lady just bursting with exciting ideas in the transition from designing in fabric to creating with leather and sometimes, leather-and-fabric. What ever the reason, and Mrs. Klein isn't for "filling in,"—the collection we previewed has both excitement and elegance in the fullest. The result in coats, suits, dresses and separates is as chic, correct, young and dynamic as Anne Klein herself.

We saw and greatly admired her black casino jacket suit of antelope, piped in calf. An A-line skimmer in garnet. A costume inspired by her husband's fur car-blanket! Buckskin in a lady-spy type trench coat lined with navy blue wool jersey. A willow-suede coat lined with willow and bone checked wool to match—the sleeveless shift (as pictured) was one of the real highlights of the collection—especially when paired with Anne Klein's matching "bobby" hat.

And then with equal deftness, Anne Klein turned from a military group to a fantastically feminine at-home group. One calculated to bring down the house was a costume of loving cowgirl pants of rust suede with wide bottoms teamed with a heavenly oyster-white

shirt, wide open at the neckline with full, full sleeves, deeply French cuffed. Anne Klein's handling of color is equal to her sense of design: purple decorations on scarlet or olive green. A pale pink bowknot on a rust sleeveless tube.

Mrs. Klein also features for the coming seasons white glove leather collar and cuffs and a long black tie stitched onto a black suede tube. And an urbanized cowgirl dress of caramel-colored glove leather. Another in roan leather with an etched silver buckle on the stitched belt. Unity Preferred To Freedom

Vich, Spain — (NC) — Spain's proposed law on religious freedom must not destroy the nation's Catholic unity, Archbishop Casimiro Morcillo, primate of Madrid, said.

"In Spain," he said, "Catholic unity is the principal cohesive element of nationality. To break it would be like breaking contact with Spanish history, literature and culture. It would mean depriving ourselves of the best support for our resurgence and prosperity and opening the door to foreign influence and sedition."

But, Archbishop Morcillo, added in a speech on religious unity here, "Catholic unity... is not an iron hoop which prevents the movement of the Church and legitimate political liberties."

"It is difficult to find in Holy Scripture a favorable answer concerning full-religious freedom," he said. But, he added, "ecumenism, the socialization of international relations and the common good of the universal Church are not philosophical or theological reasons — may, perhaps do advise the promul-

The proposed religious freedom law the archbishop was discussing was announced at a meeting of the Spanish cabinet last Sept. 10 following three years of talks between the government and representatives of the bishops.

Folk Tunes in New Mass

Buenos Aires — (NC) — An Argentine composer and a Catholic priest have combined Spanish-Indian folk rhythms and the vernacular translation of the liturgy to produce a new version of the Mass.

The composer, Ariel Ramirez, and the priest, Father J. G. Segade, call their work "Misa Criolla."

Written for choir and orchestra and sung in Spanish, the composition has won wide critical acclaim since its debut on Argentine television. A recording of the Mass is among the most popular records in Argentina and is being planned for sale throughout Spanish America.

The Misa Criolla — criolla of the work and directs the

choir of the Basilica del Socorro and the soloists, a four-man folklore group from northern Argentina called "Los Fronterizos" in the recording.

For the instrumentation, a clavichord and a springy used organ back up traditional folk instruments, guitars, drums and other percussion instruments found only in the areas in Argentina and Bolivian highlands where the music was born.

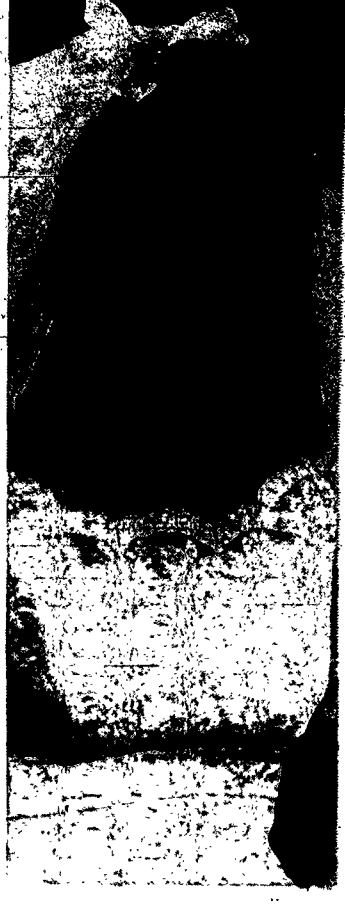
